CHAMPION SCHOOLS SPORTS ROUND UP BUCHANAN CUP

On Monday 14th October, the Buchanan Cup Grand Final was played at the Upper Great Southern Hockey Association in Narrogin. The match was between the 2018 champions Como Secondary College vs Great Southern Grammar. Having lost to Grammar in the Semi-Final round match of this competition, this was just as much a chance for redemption for Como as it was an opportunity to retain the title of Champion School for 2019.

The first half saw a reasonably tight affair. GSG had a considerable number of chances with goals eluding them. Como opened the scoring reasonably early, before Great Southern Grammar equalised. Como found the net a second time and the scores remained 2-1 for much of the first half. Como scored again late in the half and went into the break with a confident 3 - 1 lead.

As it turns out, this was a game of two halves. Como significantly raised the intensity early in the second term, netting twice within the first five minutes of the second term. They were able to stretch the capacity of Great Southern Grammar's defensive unit, and indeed the score line reflected this additional effort and quality of play.

The 8-1 final score line was convincing, and reflected the outstanding level of play from Como. Saysha Pillay was awarded the Ashleigh Nelson Player of the Match honorary medal. Congratulations to all involved in the Buchanan Cup. It has been a highly successful year.
