

2008 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

On behalf of SSWA I wish to extend to you all a sincere welcome to the 2009 AGM and acknowledge the Life Members that are present today.

I am involved in this organisation on a voluntary basis like all teachers because I believe in the achievement of healthy and active lifestyles for students in our schools through sport. SSWA is a vehicle that provides a framework of choices that presents students with quality opportunities. We as members of SSWA should use every opportunity that presents itself to promote SSWA and reinforce the values of teamwork, leadership, self-confidence and the pursuit of excellence.

School Sport WA has enjoyed a successful year with a number of innovations in management and program challenges that have added value to our product of quality competitive sport to students in all WA school. I would personally like to thank all Sports Convenors, Sports Coordinators and their committees and acknowledge their hard work, dedication and effort throughout the year in helping present our programs for students.

At an interschool level our levels of participation have maintained good participation rates but it is becoming increasingly obvious that there are many paid initiatives encroaching teacher choice to voluntarily offer their time to interschool teams.

SSWA looks forward to 2009 not only for the challenge of ensuring continued high levels of participation in grass roots competition but also to the hosting of national championships in Perth. We salute and thank the 4,500 plus teachers who assist us in the presentation of our programs and we encourage them to recruit new enthusiastic teachers to help them run the programs ensuring that we have a succession plan in place for the future.

PRIMARY ADVANCES

School Sport WA Primary is fast establishing a reputation for the provision of high quality sporting events for primary schools. The School Sport WA Primary Management Group is developing its operational structure and is forming a management process that will bring it more into line with our eastern state counterparts. Our focus for Primary Schools is to offer the opportunity to be involved in centrally coordinated quality interschool events in a number of sports. We have continued to Build the Base at the primary school level and have fostered the stronger links with parent sporting bodies. At a grass roots level the Primary offering has grown to 19 sports and is expanding in participation terms at an amazing rate. We have introduced primary participation in a number of national exchanges at the state level for Primary Schools. Primary's now compete in Cross Country, Pacific School Games, Basketball, and Tennis. The expansion in number and variety of sports presented, the increased participation numbers for events, and entry into the School Sport Australian Exchange program is exciting and encouraging.

SSWA PROGRAMS

SSWA continues its commitment to all students in WA schools with a comprehensive and diverse offering of sporting opportunity. The larger events – swimming, track and field, senior and junior country week continue to flourish with increased participation in all of these areas.

PACIFIC SCHOOL GAMES CANBERRA 2008

SSWA sent a team of over 380 athletes and 50 officials to contest the Pacific school Games from November 26 till December 8 2008. The team included Students with Disabilities, Athletics, Swimming, Diving, Hockey, Basketball and a Media group who were responsible for a daily results service, photographic record and the production of a WA specific DVD for distribution at event. The following group managers were appointed: Diving: Wayne Press, Swimming: Sara Levien, Basketball: Mark Hendon, Track & Field: David Holmes, Hockey: Debbie Gibson, Media: Peter Della-Vedova, AWD: Lorraine Feddema and Liaison Officers: Kelvin Browner and Daryl Mansfield. Congratulations to all staff that travelled with the team for their outstanding commitment, dedication, and hard word in the preparation and presentation of all teams. Many staff committed enormous hours of volunteer time and SSWA is very grateful for your outstanding commitment.

All teams performed at their very best achieving at their personal best. It was the best performance by a Pacific School Games Swimming Team with 11 Medals, 34 Finals, and 14 reserve finals reached by 29 swimmers. Congratulations to the Athletes with Disabilities on their outstanding efforts and performances in gaining 28 Medals. The Track and Field team, the Basketball and Hockey Teams performed credibly and need to be commended on their efforts and dedication. The next Pacific School Games will be held in 2012 at a venue to be decided and we look forward to competing in that event.

2008 SCHOOL SPORT WA DIRECTOR'S REPORT

School Sport Western Australia (SSWA) hosted two national championships in 2008. The Secondary Tennis Championship incorporating the Pizzey Cup was held at the Alexander Park Tennis Club and the Surfing Championship was conducted in Margaret River. In 2009 SSWA looks forward to hosting the Football Championships in August and the Swimming and Diving Championships in September.

The office is staffed by Peter Smith - Director of Sport, Darryl Bell - Executive Officer, Zoë Prue - Sports Administrator, Christine Sheen - Finance Officer and Rene Hutton - Trainee. I would once again like to commend Darryl, Zoë, Christine and Rene for their outstanding commitment to SSWA.

The SSWA AGM was held in March and all management positions were filled. Murray Farr continues in the role of President with Peter Sinclair – Secondary Committee Chairperson and Darryl Bell – Primary Committee Chairperson.

Industrial action during 2008 impacted on participation numbers for the Champion Schools competitions. Many of the competitions were held with reduced numbers.

In 2008 we had 53 schools compete in our Swimming Carnivals at Challenge Stadium and 44 schools in the Track and Field Carnivals at Perry Lakes. Our Primary and Secondary Triathlons attracted over 1000 competitors and more than 2500 athletes ran in the Cross Country events.

The SSWA Presentation Evening was held in December recognising team officials, sport coordinators, team captains, Australian representatives and medal winners. Special presentations were made to key officials from our National events hosted during the year, State Sporting Associations and the Department of Education and Training for their support throughout the year. The event was held as a formal dinner for the first time and was a very successful function.

The School Sport WA interstate team program continues to grow. Boys and Girls Primary Hockey teams participated for the first time in 2008 at the Pacific School Games. A total of 724 students and 121 team officials represented SSWA in our 2008 Interstate Team program.

The SSWA web site continues to be a very valuable resource. The online nomination process has been very successful and schools are using the service heavily to nominate for our events. Online event feedback from students, parents and team officials was added in 2008.

The 10th District High Schools Country Week was held in September with 35 schools and over 1000 competitors taking part. The 70th Senior High Schools Country Week had 27 schools represented. Many schools from the larger country regions did not attend due to the industrial dispute. AFL football for girls was included in the participating sports for the first time.

A total of 59 staff and 378 students travelled to the Pacific School Games in Canberra. This was the largest team that SSWA has ever taken to this event. Whilst we experienced some issues with the conduct of the Track and Field competition the event was generally a huge success for all who attended.

The SSWA involvement in the South West region continues to grow and processes with procedures being instigated in this region having potential for replication in other major regional areas of WA. SSWA is now funding a part-time sports administrator to coordinate activities in the South West region.

SSWA takes this opportunity to thank all students, teachers and key delivery agents who assisted in any way with the presentation of School Sport WA in 2008. Special thanks to the management committee, the sport coordinators and their committees for their untiring voluntary efforts. The substantial contribution of the SSWA office staff is acknowledged and they are thanked for their outstanding dedication to the efficient operation of the organisation.

School Sport WA looks forward with anticipation to a very busy year ahead and to the continued support of teachers in schools who volunteer their time to planning and preparing teams for events on behalf of their students.

2008 SECONDARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

2008 was a very successful year for secondary school sport. The quality and number of sporting opportunities afforded to students and teachers alike continues to grow in both quality and quantity.

SSWA competed in 20 sports at secondary state level, sending away 26 teams or contingents. The SSWA Office conducted our flagship events of secondary Swimming and secondary Track and Field Carnivals. Despite a year of protracted industrial action, the annual Country Senior High Schools Carnival and also the District High Schools Carnival were again managed efficiently and effectively, bringing a wonderful sporting opportunity to thousands of country students. Additionally, WA successfully hosted two National Championships in Pizzey Cup Tennis and Surfing.

Champion Schools competitions were conducted in 28 different sports involving thousands of teachers and tens of thousands of students. Right through the school year, school children engage in active, healthy, well structured sport through the Champions Schools Competitions.

The Secondary Management Committee continues to meet regularly to review policies and procedures as they relate to secondary school sport. Thank you to our Regional representatives for their ongoing work in linking SSWA and Sport in secondary schools. The network created through our regional representatives ensures we are linked directly to teachers in schools, allowing us to respond more directly to their needs. The activities of the South West Region continue to expand beckoning further growth in country areas.

The Pacific School Games in December 2008 were a great success with Western Australia sending away their largest ever PSG Contingent. The level of planning and preparation, led by the SSWA Office and involving dozens of volunteer staff members was not only extremely professional and competent but was applauded by PSG organisers and in many cases envied by other states. The contingent of primary and secondary students in Track and Field, Swimming, Diving, Hockey and Basketball were wonderful ambassadors for Western Australia and were able to experience international competition.

One of the keys to our success in offering so many wonderful and successful sporting opportunities is the talent and cohesiveness of our Office Staff. There commitment and professionalism enhance the work of all our volunteers. They deserve and have our gratitude.

One of our immediate challenges is to maintain interest amongst the many thousands of teachers who make up our volunteer base. Coming after a year of industrial action that asked teachers not undertake non essential tasks, it is refreshing indeed to see the number of teachers who have volunteered to enhance the sporting opportunities offered to our students.

2008 PRIMARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

After a year that included industrial action, teacher shortages and major disruption within the education system it is pleasing to note that School Sport WA (SSWA) continued to grow. At primary level SSWA sport programs attracted more schools with most events showing an increase in the number of participants. Cross Country is the largest participator sport with over 1520 athletes, triathlon increased to 238 teams with a second event offered at Champion Lakes, AFL Football attracted 524 teams, swimming carnivals were well supported with several new schools involved and equestrian was endorsed as an approved SSWA sport.

In 2008 ninety two primary students represented Western Australia as members of SSWA State teams participating at National Championships. The premier event at this level was the Pacific School Games (PSG) held in Canberra. Involvement in the PSG enabled SSWA to promote and encourage development of high level sport opportunities for primary school students. At this international event young students participated in basketball, diving, hockey, swimming and track & field. From the initial trials through to competition, team coaches and managers identified and acknowledged the vast improvement, skill development and experience gained by all involved. Teams also competed in 'Bruce Cup' tennis in Newcastle, Cross Country in Geelong, and Rugby League in Darwin.

With the developing program offered through SSWA there is growing interest from primary sport groups to attend School Sport Australia National Championships. The Primary Management Group assesses each application and indicates a number of requirements for each sport to address prior to inclusion in the national program. Several sports are working hard to establish their position in the program as they move towards inclusion.

State Sporting Associations have continued to support our programs with many keen to develop links in schools and become involved with State Team preparation and presentation. State Association involvement is an important aspect for SSWA sport development programs and in the provision of sport opportunities for students.

We acknowledge and thank the hard working Primary Management Group (PMG) who continue to consolidate existing events and develop new programs. All members are convenors for a number of events and their liaison with coordinators is an important part of the process that ensures that SSWA presents quality sport events. The PMG has reviewed sport programs offered to ensure that they all conform to the expectation of the Association. Following the review both handball and lacrosse were removed from the approved sport list. PMG communicated with all sports on the approved list to re-establish the standard operational and presentation requirements. Adjustments were also made for both swimming and cross country events where school nominations for SSWA events will be by year groups instead of age grouping. This change will be for a trial period of twelve months.

The valuable contribution of Marc Arnold to the development of SSWA Primary is recognised. Marc was a Management Group member for four years and is currently pursuing interests outside of teaching.

We also congratulate and thank the many teachers who volunteer countless hours to planning and preparing teams for events.

The SSWA office staff (Peter, Zoe, Christine and Rene) continues to provide outstanding support to all sport coordinators and are warmly acknowledged for their input into the success of the primary sport programs.
