

2009 PRIMARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The interstate Championship program took another positive step forward with the inclusion of Primary Hockey into the School Sport WA (SSWA) commitment to promoting sport in schools. The 12 Years State Schoolboys and Schoolgirls teams competed in Newcastle and performed creditably. The coaches and managers are to be congratulated for their involvement.

In 2010 the School Sport Australia Australian Rules Football Championship will be held in Perth. As it is a home event a 12 Years Primary State Schoolboys team will be selected and compete for the first time. The Championship will allow promotion of the sport in schools and also recognise the involvement of SSWA in extended competition.

For many years the Primary School Cross Country event has been held at Perry Lakes but with the impending closure of the stadium the committee investigated the option of another quality venue. The University of WA Sports Park in Mount Claremont was selected as the most suitable option and the 2009 event was successfully conducted. The venue provides a challenging course where all runners can be seen as they compete and the start/finish area allows spectators to vocally support and encourage their athletes.

School Sport WA was approached by Triathlon Australia to conduct the Primary Schools triathlon as a lead up event for the World Long Course Triathlon Championship. The SSWA event was moved from Nedlands Foreshore to Langley Park on the edge of the Swan River with the backdrop of Perth City. Athletes experienced competition on a world class course utilising the World Triathlon event infrastructure. This highly successful opportunity for students was a highlight of the sporting calendar.

There are a number of challenges ahead and to enable the Association to continue to evolve it is crucial that teachers be sourced and encouraged to participate in SSWA activities. Schools need to give priority to further developing and extending SSWA programs within their districts.

2009 SCHOOL SPORT WA DIRECTOR'S REPORT

School Sport Western Australia (SSWA) celebrated 100 years of operation in 2009 having commenced way back in 1909. To coincide with this milestone SSWA is commissioning a visual and oral history of the association and interviewing key SSWA personnel. SSWA is also compiling a written record of Office Bearers, key officials and Interstate Team Officials.

SSWA hosted two national championships in 2009. The Secondary Football Championship was held at Lark Hill, Secret Harbour in August and the Swimming and Diving Championships were held in Perth in September. In 2010 SSWA looks forward to hosting the Baseball Championship in May, AFL Football Championship in July and the Boys and Girls Hockey Championships in August.

The office was staffed by Peter Smith - Director of Sport, Darryl Bell - Executive Officer, Wayne Baseden - A/Executive Officer, Zoë Prue - Sports Administrator, Christine Sheen - Finance Officer and Sally Zirnis - Education Department Trainee. I would once again like to commend Darryl, Wayne, Zoë, Christine and Sally for their outstanding commitment to SSWA.

The SSWA AGM was held in April and all management positions were filled. Murray Farr continues in the role of President with Peter Sinclair – Secondary Committee Chairperson and Darryl Bell – Primary Committee Chairperson.

Following teacher Industrial action during 2008 participation numbers for the Champion Schools competitions returned to normal participation levels in 2009.

In 2009 we had 54 schools compete in our Swimming Carnivals at Challenge Stadium and 51 schools in the Track and Field Carnivals at the new WA Athletics Centre. Our Primary and Secondary Triathlons attracted over 1000 competitors and more than 2500 athletes ran in the Cross Country events.

The School Sport WA interstate team program continues to grow. A total of 612 students and 86 team officials represented SSWA in our 2009 Interstate Team program.

The SSWA website continues to be a very valuable resource. The online nomination process has been very successful and schools are using the service heavily to nominate for our events. In 2009 all interstate team representatives were required to complete an online registration form to confirm their place in the team.

The 11th District High Schools Country Week was held in September with 36 schools and over 1000 competitors taking part. Badminton was included in DHS Country Week sports for the first time. The 71st Senior High Schools Country Week had 43 schools represented which is the largest number on record.

The SSWA Presentation Evening was held in December recognising team officials, sport coordinators, team captains, Australian representatives and medal winners. Special presentations were made to key officials involved in hosting our National events, State Sporting Associations and the Department of Education for their support throughout the year. Darryl Bell and Peter Rickers were announced as very worthy Life members of SSWA on the night. The event was held as a formal dinner for the second time and was a very successful function.

SSWA held an inaugural Christmas Volunteer BBQ and Golf Day for all Management Committee members, Sport Coordinators and Interstate Team Officials in December. The event was well supported and proved a valuable means of rewarding and thanking our large team of volunteers.

SSWA takes this opportunity to thank all students, teachers and key delivery agents who assisted in any way with the presentation of School Sport WA in 2009. Special thanks to the management committee, the sport coordinators and their committees for their untiring voluntary efforts. The substantial contribution of the SSWA office staff is acknowledged and they are thanked for their outstanding dedication to the efficient operation of the organisation.

SSWA would also like to take this opportunity to thank Darryl Bell for his outstanding service to the Association over the past 3 years. As Executive Officer, Darryl has made a substantial contribution to SSWA and overseen a huge expansion in the Primary sector of our organisation and we wish him well in the future.

School Sport WA looks forward with anticipation to another busy year in 2010 and to the continued support of teachers in schools who volunteer their time to planning and preparing teams for events on behalf of their students.

2009 was again full of activity for Secondary School Sport. As always, thanks are due to the vast number of teacher volunteers who conduct our Interstate and Champion Schools Competitions. Through their efforts, SSWA has reached tens of thousands of secondary school students.

SSWA competed in over 20 sports at secondary state level, welcoming Volleyball back for 2009. The SSWA Office conducted our flagship events of secondary Swimming and secondary Track and Field Carnivals; and again we saw increased numbers competing in the annual Country Senior High Schools Carnival and also in the District High Schools Carnival. Additionally, WA successfully hosted the School Sport Australia National Championships in Football, Swimming and Diving.

Champion Schools competitions were conducted in 28 different sports. 2009 saw the return of boys and girls Water Polo. Every school week of the year, thousands and thousands of school children engage in active, healthy, well structured sport through the Champion Schools Competitions.

The Secondary Management Committee continues to meet regularly to review policies and procedures as they relate to secondary school sport. During 2009 we welcomed new members to our committee and at the same time rewarded one with Life membership. Our heartiest congratulations go to Peter Rickers.
