

2010 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

SSWA through its members (i.e. all schools) has again delivered quality opportunities through SPORT for all students. Thanks must surely go to the Convenors, Sport Secretaries and the Sport committees for their conduct of SSWA domestic competitions and acknowledge their hard work, dedication and effort throughout the year in helping present our programs for students. School Sport WA suffered a sad loss in 2010 with the passing of Darryl Bell. Darryl was the SSWA Executive Officer from 2007 to 2009, held the position of Primary Management Committee Chairperson from 1999 to 2009 and a well respected coach of our interstate Basketball teams for over 10 years. Darryl was made a life member of School Sport WA in 2009 for his contribution of many hours to SSWA activities and was a valued and highly respected member of our organisation.

SSWA officially launched the School Sport WA 'Darryl Bell' Wall of Fame at the SSWA Presentation Dinner in December. The Wall of Fame was named in memory of Darryl Bell for his vision and dedication in seeing the wall of fame become a reality. The Wall of Fame is designed to recognise athletes who have represented SSWA through the interstate program and have excelled in their sport to a national or international level.

School Sport WA would like to thank Wayne Baseden and Alex McLennan who acted in the Executive Officer position early in the year and assisted in the efficient operation of many events and activities during this time. SSWA welcomed Jenny O'Brien to the Executive Officer position in June 2010.

I would like to thank the office staff of Zoe Prue – Sports Administrator, Christine Sheen – Finance Officer and Sally Zirnis – Education Department Trainee for their outstanding commitment to SSWA over the year. The SSWA AGM was held in April and all management positions were filled. Murray Farr continues in the role of President with Peter Sinclair re-appointed Secondary Committee Chairperson and Peter Della-Vedova appointed Primary Committee Chairperson.

SSWA hosted three National Championships in 2010. The Baseball Championship in May was held at Baseball Park, Thornlie. The AFL Championship was held in July utilising several grounds around Perth. The ALF Championship saw SSWA enter a team in the AFL 12's competition for the first time. The Boys and Girls Hockey Championships were hosted in Bunbury and Busselton. This was SSWA's first National event to be held regionally for many years and the support we received from the local community was outstanding.

SSWA participated in 21 School Sport Australia Championships in 2010 which involved 572 students and 89 staff in 32 teams attending events all around Australia. The Boys 15s AFL team and Boys Volleyball team were both successful in winning the National Title.

Congratulations to the AFL boys 15yrs team and the boys Volleyball team on winning the School Sport Australia Championship titles in 2010.

Our Country Week events are still a highlight on the SSWA event calendar and continue to be strongly supported by regional schools attracting strong media coverage by local press. Senior High School Country week brings over 3500 students and staff to Perth for a week long sporting carnival in July and District High Schools Country week sees almost 1000 staff and students from smaller and remote schools attend.

Our Champion Schools program continues to flourish under the direction of our sport coordinators. In 2010 the Primary Basketball Champion Schools event saw Basketball WA taking on the overall organisation in conjunction with School Sport WA. With the support of their local State League clubs the event has now gone regional. The traditional one day carnival, now known as the Association's Cup, has grown to 8 regions with 23 schools involved and 73 teams nominated. We look forward to seeing this event grow further in 2011.

SSWA takes this opportunity to thank all students, teachers and key delivery agents who assisted in any way with the presentation of School Sport WA in 2010. Special thanks to the management committee, the sport coordinators and their committees for their untiring voluntary efforts.

School Sport WA looks forward with anticipation to another busy year in 2011 and to the continued support of teachers in schools who volunteer their time to planning and preparing teams for events on behalf of their students.

2010 SECONDARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

2010 was a very successful year for Secondary School sport. The quality and number of sporting opportunities afforded to students and teachers alike continued to grow in both quality and quantity. Thanks again to the vast number of teacher volunteers. Our Interstate and Champion Schools Competitions included tens of thousands of secondary school students.

SSWA competed in 18 sports at secondary state level, sending away 26 teams or contingents. SSWA Office conducted our flagship events of secondary Swimming and secondary Track and Field Carnivals; and again we saw increased numbers competing in the annual Country Senior High Schools Carnival and also in the District High Schools Carnival. Additionally, WA successfully hosted National Championships in Boys and Girls Hockey and Boys and Girls AFL Football.

Champion Schools competitions were conducted in 27 different sports involving thousands of teachers and tens of thousands of students. Every school week of the year, thousands and thousands of school children engage in active, healthy, well structured sport through the Champions Schools Competitions.

The Secondary Management Committee continues to meet regularly to review policies and procedures as they relate to secondary school sport. Thank you to our Regional representatives for their ongoing work in linking SSWA and Sport in secondary schools. The network created through our regional representatives ensures we are linked directly to teachers in schools, allowing us to respond more directly to their needs. Our South West region continues to grow and 2010 saw the retirement of our South West Regional Officer (and former SSWA President and Life Member) Ian McMahon. We welcome Tracy Cameron to the role and wish her well for 2011.

Finally, let me thank the amazing range of volunteer teachers without whom our sports would not operate. Your efforts are the mainstay of SSWA. Thank you also to the extremely efficient and hard working SSWA Office Staff and to the members of the Secondary Management Committee for their diligence and dedication to School Sport in Western Australia.

2010 PRIMARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The Primary sector continues to grow in the interstate area. There are a variety of sports that are now part of the interstate calendar and this is this is pleasing to see. The commitment and dedication of the team managers and coaches is to be commended. The Primary sector is certainly a growth area for SSWA.

WA hosted the National AFL Championship in Perth in 2010 with a Primary team competing for the first time. The selection process was quite rigorous in selecting a team of 23. The boys in the team acquitted themselves superbly and they were most competitive with the other AFL states. The coaches and managers did a wonderful job in fostering the ethos of School Sport while encouraging the players to compete vigorously.

The Primary Cross Country was again a huge event held at UWA Sports Park in Mount Claremont. The number of participants has peaked at about 1500 but the event is a major part of many schools' running calendar.
