SECONDARY SPORT

SSWA continues its commitment to all students in WA schools with a comprehensive and diverse offering of sporting opportunity. SSWA secondary sport continues to flourish, with our major events - Swimming and Track and Field increasing in number of competing students. Both the Senior High Schools Country Week and the District High School Country Week increased in size and participation numbers.

PRIMARY ADVANCES

School Sport WA Primary is fast establishing a reputation for the provision of high quality sporting events for primary schools. The School Sport WA Primary Management Group is developing its operational structure and is forming a management process that will bring it more into line with our eastern state counterparts. Our focus for Primary Schools is to offer the opportunity to be involved in centrally coordinated quality interschool events in a number of sports. We have continued to "Build the Base" at the primary school level and have fostered the stronger links with parent sporting bodies. The expansion in number and variety of sports presented, the increased participation numbers for events, and entry into the School Sport Australian Exchange program is exciting and encouraging.

DOMESTIC EVENTS conducted by SSWA involve almost 80,000 students and approximately 4,500 teachers in 27 different sports. In 2011 at the interstate level SSWA has presented 28 secondary and 10 primary teams involving over 600 students and 100 officials. We also have teachers and students representing School Sport Australia in International Sporting events. School Sport WA is the biggest provider of sporting opportunities for students in WA schools and we are proud of our contribution to the provision of healthy activity for our young people.

School Sport WA would like to thank Jennifer O'Brien for her service to School Sport WA in the role of Executive Officer. Robyn is proving to be a real asset to the organisation and is assisting in the efficient operation of many events and activities conducted by SSWA.

I would like to thank the office staff of Zoe Prue – Sports Administrator, Christine Sheen – Finance Officer and Sally Zirnig – Junior Sports Administrator for their outstanding commitment to SSWA over the year. The SSWA AGM was held in April and all management positions were filled. Murray Farr continues in the role of President with Peter Sinclair re-appointed Secondary Committee Chairperson and Peter Della-Vedova re-appointed Primary Committee Chairperson.

SSWA hosted two National Championships in 2011. The Netball Championship in July - August was held at the State Basketball Centre and the Volleyball Championship was held in Mandurah in August. In 2011, SSWA competed in over 20 sports at secondary state level. 2011 PRIMARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The Primary sector continues to grow in the interstate area. There are a variety of sports that are now part of the interstate calendar and this is pleasing to see. The commitment and dedication of the team managers and coaches is to be commended. The Primary sector is certainly a growth area for SSWA.

A WA Primary team travelled for the first time to the National AFL Championship in Canberra in 2011. The selection process was quite rigorous in selecting a team of 23. The boys in the team acquitted themselves superbly and they were most competitive with the other AFL states. The coaches and managers did a wonderful job in fostering the ethos of School Sport while encouraging the players to compete vigorously.

The Primary Cross Country was again a huge event held at UWA Sports Park in Mount Claremont. The number of participants has peaked at about 1500 but the event is a major part of many schools' running calendar. The weather isn't always kind to the organisers but the day is always enjoyed by all. The organisers do a superb job in making sure the event runs smoothly and efficiently at all times. Thanks especially to Daryl Mansfield for stepping up to the organiser's role and running such a superb day.

We again had a primary contingent in the National Cross Country event in Canberra. These students acquitted themselves well in the face of strong opposition from the other states. It is pleasing to see a number of primary teachers being part of staffing for this annual event.

Another team sport to begin at the interstate level was 12 year old girls and boys football. (Soccer) The teams travelled to Canberra and were amazed at the level of the other states. Exposure to better competition can only benefit our players. The teams had an enjoyable trip and look forward to better results in 2012.

It is pleasing to see the number of Primary teachers who are becoming involved in SSWA events. Many are then stepping up in to management and coaching roles at the interstate level. The challenge still exists for our organisation to encourage more teachers to participate as leaders in the events overseen by SSWA, both at the interschool and the interstate levels.

The role of SSWA has been well documented and it does play the most significant part in providing sporting opportunities for students in WA schools.
