

2012 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

WHAT ARE WE ABOUT?

SSWA through its committees has again delivered quality educational opportunities through SPORT for students. Thanks must go to the Sport Coordinators, Convenors and the School Sport Office for conducting sporting programs in the domestic school setting on behalf of SSWA. These competitions epitomise and highlight what SSWA is all about.

WHY HAVE SCHOOL SPORT?

I maintain that School Sport offers the school community opportunities to build a strong identity and culture of excellence. Traditionally values of RESPECT, FAIRNESS, RESPONSIBILITY and RESILENCE are developed as part of students' participation. School Sport is often a partnership between the school and local community organisations, which work together to develop students' abilities and to foster student aspirations for interesting and rewarding lives. Why School Sport? Links to literacy and numeracy need to be highlighted. For School Sport to be successful there needs to be a link with attendance and engagement. The teaching force needs to not only be capable but empowered as without teachers there will be no programs. Sixty percent (60%) of students are not involved in sport so at the school level it should be a quality experience. Sport should be compulsory in schools. All Primary Schools should have specialised Physical Education Teachers. Research has shown that school sport from an early age (i.e. 10 Years old) lays the foundation for healthy active lifestyle. High quality sport lifts and raises academic performance and develops lifelong habits and skills enhancing the whole of life outcomes.

"School Sport and Physical Education improve students' **concentration, memory, behaviour and academic performance.** Schools can lift the performance and outcomes for their students by offering programmes designed to maximise participation, enjoyment and personal reward. High performing schools utilize Sport and Physical Education programs to help motivate students and support learners in their academic work".*

One of the most significant responsibilities we have as SSWA members and as educators are to give young Australians a strong foundation on which to build a full and active life. Sport has been linked to positive self-esteem, skill development, skeletal and cardio-vascular health, and general healthy development. It is now widely established that childhood is the best time to establish positive attitudes and behaviours related to physical activity and a healthy lifestyle.

Young people spend a significant amount of time at school and therefore school environments need to be supportive of students being physically active. School Sport programs are an important part of a comprehensive approach to providing this support. School Sport is the vehicle that enables daily and lifelong healthy living practices that are transferred between school, home, the local community and interstate teams. Instilling School Sport values in an educative setting gives opportunities for students to develop their strategic capacity to make informed decisions in leading healthy and active lives.

VOLUNTEERS ARE OUR LIFE LINE

We need to be extra careful with all of our volunteers. They need to be recognised for the work which they carry out on behalf of SSWA. It is becoming increasingly more difficult to get volunteers to help run our committees and programs. We need to be careful we don't burn people out because of their willingness to take on large work load. We do however need to be on the constant lookout for new, young and enthusiastic teachers to help run our programs. We also need to be aware that these people are volunteers and need to be recognised and rewarded for their efforts.

GREAT LEADERSHIP AND SUPPORT

We are very fortunate to have **Kim WARD** as our representative on the National Representative School Sport Committee (NRSSC). He has continually supported SSWA in it endeavours to have School Sport Australia (SSA) comply with Education Department policy. In particular the taking out of Insurance by SSA, the compliance of International Tours to Education Policy and finally the concept of equal representation at SSA meetings by each State and Territory. This is something that Ian Temby, Ian McMahon, Jeff Scott and I have been advocating for 25 Years. I am glad that it is coming to fruition and will be established in November 2013 with the adoption of new constitutional changes to School Sport Australia. SSWA has also been very fortunate with another terrific leader and supporter of School Sport in our direct line Manager **Karen WEBSTER**.

SUMMARY OF EVENTS

What an unbelievable year we have had at SSWA during 2012. We hosted three magnificent National Championships. The Triathlon held in Busselton, Golf held at Melville Glades, Mt Lawley and WA Golf Club courses and the 12's Bruce Cup Tennis held at Alexander Park Tennis Club. All events were outstanding and received numerous accolades from visiting state officials and parents. We won gold in the 12's Boys and Girls Hockey. What an outstanding effort!! We were a credible 2nd in Girls AFL Football and Boys Volleyball, 3rd in Triathlon and Boy's 18 Basketball. Both the Senior High School and District High School Country Week competitions grow from strength to strength. Congratulations to all who contributed. Primary School Sport is

continuing to expand, both at the domestic level of competition and interstate championship level. Keep up the good work! I believe this is a direct result of having Robyn Brierley in the Office.

NATIONAL SCENE

The School Sport Australia State Presidents' group meeting devotes time to issues that each State and Territory has and we share ideas and possible solutions to those issues. As well as issues that affect the running of SSA. Under the new constitution, which if passed, will come into effect in November 2013 for 2014 there will be a new structure for SSA. Each State and Territory jurisdiction will be represented on the Management Board for SSA. At the moment WA is fortunate in that we have two representatives. Peter Smith and I represent SSWA's perspective of School Sport. Also future conferences for SSA will be limited to one per year.

FUTURE CHALLENGES

I have already spoken about the volunteer and the importance of being vigilant in our recruitment of young teachers. SSWA also needs to identify and document its champions of Sport in our champion Schools competitions to recognise schools that do School Sport well. We need good stories at all levels - School, Zone and Region. We could also include National and International stories as well. This will help SSWA in maintaining and keeping up-to-date records for the Darryl Bell Wall of Fame.

CONCLUSION

The SSWA Sport Coordinators and Interstate Officials give an enormous amount of volunteer time and effort to ensure that our programs are conducted professionally and efficiently. Without their valuable involvement we would be unable to present the extensive number of sports that we do. We acknowledge our fantastic Sport Coordinators and Interstate Officials and ask them to continue in this role for 2013.

On behalf of SSWA I would like to thank the office staff of Peter Smith, Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt, Zoe Prue, Christine Sheen, Sally Zirnis and the SSWA Management board for their ongoing excellent contribution to the increased efficiencies of SSWA, their professional work ethic and outstanding contribution in running and promoting the association. On behalf of SSWA, I applaud this generous donation of time that is freely given by so many of our volunteers; I believe participation in our programs allows students to achieve a wide range of educational outcomes. Once again I look forward to the coming year for your continued support, effort and dedication in helping organise and coordinate school sport as part of the wider family of SSWA.

School Sport WA would like to thank Robyn Brierley [Executive Officer], Lynda Merritt [Sports Administrator], Zoe Prue [Sports Administrator], Christine Sheen [Finance Officer] and Sally Zirnis [Junior Sports Administrator] for their outstanding commitment to SSWA over the year.

The SSWA AGM was held on Thursday 29th March and all management positions were filled. Murray Farr and Peter Della-Vedova were re-appointed to their roles of President and Primary Committee Chairperson respectively.

SSWA hosted three School Sport Australia National Championships in 2012. The Triathlon Championship was held in Busselton, the 19yrs and Under Golf in Perth and the Bruce Cup 12yrs Tennis at Alexander Park Tennis Club. All events were extremely successful and showcased our wonderful state and our expertise in hosting National Championships.

SSWA participated in 20 School Sport Australia Championships in 2012 which involved 601 students and 103 staff in 35 teams attending events all around Australia. The boys and girls 12yrs Hockey teams both won their Championship in Adelaide. The girl's golf team were also successful at their Championship in Perth.

Senior High School and District High School Country Week events are still a highlight on the SSWA event calendar and continue to be strongly supported by regional schools attracting strong media coverage by local press. Senior High School Country week brings over 3500 students and staff to Perth for a week long sporting carnival in July and District High Schools Country week sees almost 1000 staff and students from smaller and remote schools in attendance.

Our Champion Schools program continues to grow under the direction of our sport coordinators.

School Sport WA hosted the School Sport Australia National Conference in Mandurah in early November. SSWA received high praise from the conference delegates for an excellent two day conference.

SSWA takes this opportunity to thank all students, teachers and key delivery agents who assisted in any way with the presentation of School Sport WA in 2012. Special thanks to the management committee, the sport coordinators and their committees for their untiring voluntary efforts.

2012 was again full of activity for Secondary School Sport. As always, thanks are due to the vast number of teacher volunteers who conduct our Interstate and Champion Schools Competitions. Through their efforts, SSWA has reached tens of thousands of secondary school students.

In 2012, SSWA competed in over 19 sports at secondary state level. The SSWA Office conducted our flagship events of secondary swimming and secondary track and field carnivals; and again we saw increased numbers competing in the annual Country Senior High Schools Carnival and also in the District High Schools Carnival. Additionally, WA successfully hosted SSA National Championships in Triathlon and Golf.

Champion Schools' competitions were conducted in 20 different sports at secondary level. Every school week of the year, thousands and thousands of school children engage in active, healthy, well structured sport through the Champion Schools Competitions.

Thank you to our regional representatives for their ongoing work in linking SSWA and Sport in secondary schools. The network created through our regional representatives ensures we are linked directly to teachers in schools, allowing us to respond more directly to their needs.

2012 PRIMARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The Primary sector is certainly a growth area for SSWA. The number of sports on the interstate calendar increases every year. We are also getting more and more primary teachers involved in managing and coaching the interstate teams. The commitment and dedication of the team managers and coaches is to be commended.

A WA team attended the National AFL Championship in Adelaide. The selection process was quite rigorous in selecting a team of 23. The boys in the team acquitted themselves well and they were competitive with the other states. The coaches and managers did a great job in fostering the ethos of SSWA while encouraging the players to compete to the best of their ability.

Primary netball was our newest interstate sport this year with a team attending the national event in Adelaide. It was a huge learning experience for our girls. They showed pleasing development as the tournament progressed.

The Primary Cross Country was again a huge event held at UWA Sports Park in Mount Claremont. The number of participants has peaked at about 1500 but the event is a major part of many schools' running calendar. The weather isn't always kind to the organisers but the day is always enjoyed by all. The organisers do a superb job in making sure the event runs smoothly and efficiently at all times. Thanks especially to Daryl Mansfield for stepping up to the organiser's role and running such a superb day.

We again had a primary contingent in the National Cross country event in Adelaide. They competed in the worst conditions but managed to finish which was a major achievement in itself. The staff and students are all to be commended on their positive attitudes and exemplary behaviour during the entire trip. A big thank you to Luke Cunningham and Vicki Delves who stepped in to manage the primary teams at the last moment. They did a superb job.

Another team sport in their third year of competition at the interstate level was 12 year old girls and boys Football(Soccer). The teams travelled to Darwin and enjoyed competing against the other states. This competition will benefit our players in the future. Staff and students had an enjoyable trip.

School Sport WA successfully hosted the Bruce Cup Primary Tennis Championship in Perth for the first time. The event was held at the Alexander Park Tennis Club and was an outstanding competition.

It is pleasing to see the number of primary school teachers who are becoming involved in SSWA events. Many are then stepping up in to management and coaching roles at the interstate level. The challenge still exists for our organisation to encourage more teachers to participate as leaders in the events overseen by SSWA, both at the interschool and the interstate levels.

The role of SSWA has been well documented and it does play the most significant part in providing sporting opportunities for students in WA schools. The volunteers are an essential part of our organisation being able to provide these events for our students. However, the role of the SSWA office staff cannot be underestimated. The hard work and dedication of the office team is another critical factor in the quantity and quality that is offered to WA students. My sincere thanks to Peter Smith, Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt, Zoe Prue, Christine Sheen and Sally Zirnis.

Robyn Brierley is now filling the role of Executive Officer at SSWA. She continues to work diligently for the primary cause. Lorraine Feddema has been involved in developing the students with disability area. John Lawniczak and Daryl Mansfield have again run a number of sports and have taken teams away to interstate competitions. Alex McLennan has stepped in to co-ordinate a number of sports and has also travelled away as a manager of an interstate team. I have continued my involvement with SSWA although heading to the retirement pasture.

Our challenges in the near future are in introducing new interstate sports, the adjustments necessary with the year 7's moving to high school and getting new teachers involved in school sport.

Many thanks to the Primary Management Group of Daryl Mansfield, John Lawniczak, Robyn Brierley, Alex McLennan and Lorraine Feddema. Your efforts are much appreciated.
