2013 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

WHAT AN OUTSTANDING YEAR FOR SSWA ON THE INTERSTATE SCENE

It all started with our Cricket team winning a Gold medal, defeating NSW in the Championship held in Perth. Our Triathlon team won a Bronze medal in the overall team placing. At the second of our Championships held in Perth this year the Softball team finished with a Bronze medal. This was followed by our Baseball team who played in Geelong winning a Silver medal. SSWA hosted the Water-Polo here this year and our SSWA Boys team won Gold and the Girls team won Silver. Our Pizzey Cup Tennis team finished 4th. Our victories kept coming, the AFL girls' team winning the Gold medal by beating Victoria in Darwin. The Primary Netball team in its second year of competition won the Bronze medal. Cross Country excelled with Ben Chamberlain winning a Gold medal in the 14-15 year age group. Ben was also part of a Silver medal team winning group with Luke Graves, Brandon Swift and Jesse Rodgers. Douglas Foulkes-Taylor ran brilliantly to win the Silver medal in 16-17 age group. And the medals roll on with the 16's Netball winning Silver in Tasmania. Our Swimming and Diving teams had great success in Adelaide with a huge number of PB's being achieved.

SSWA hosted 5 National Championships this year and all events were received with excellent reviews by all visiting states and territories. Credit must be awarded to our SSWA office and the meticulous work by our volunteer convenors, for each of those Championships, for their outstanding success.

WHY IS SCHOOL SPORT WESTERN AUSTRALIA RECOGNISED

School Sport Western Australia is recognised as enhancing the lifestyle of students in school by encouraging the school spirit, building self-esteem, encouraging teamwork and providing opportunities for the development of positive attitudes and practices over a wide range of sporting experiences in an educational context.

Participation in sport in school programs run by SSWA provides a framework which gives students the opportunity to learn and consolidate essential knowledge and understandings about a healthy and active lifestyle; to acquire and practice movement skills; to develop positive attitudes and values of fair play, the acknowledgement of excellence and reward for endeavour.

SSWA programs provide a framework which allows students the opportunities to progressively develop and extend their knowledge, understandings, values and skills in sport, assisting students to become healthy individuals with the ability and confidence to manage their own lifestyles. Sport in schools provides a range of experiences at a variety of levels that allows for differences between students, including the development of leadership skills and becoming a member of a team.

SSWA programs provide students with the opportunity to develop decision making skills, self-analysis and interpersonal skills that will assist them to achieve lifelong pursuits of an active and healthy lifestyle.

VOLUNTEERS ARE ESSENTIAL FOR SSWA

SSWA recognises the significant amount of volunteer time given in the running of our domestic competitions and our interstate programs. We have instigated an annual volunteers' function to help recognise the huge amount of work done by volunteers on our behalf. The winner of the President's Award for 2013, for the Management Group, goes to **Alex McLennan** for his outstanding contribution in 2013. We need to be careful that we don't burn volunteers out because of their willingness to take on large work-loads. Again we need to be on the constant lookout for new, enthusiastic teachers to help run our programs.

This year in our newsletter we chose a number of our volunteers to highlight and they were; **Gemma Hadley, Sue Thomson, Andrea Rundle, Narelle Scott, Tracey Carrington, Ian Dignon, Kylie Glancy, Keith Harper, Clayton Bird and Aaron Berryman.**

GREAT LEADERSHIP AND SUPPORT

We are very fortunate that we have **Kim WARD** as our representative on the National Representative School Sport Committee (NRSSC). He has continually supported SSWA in its endeavours to have School Sport Australia (SSA) comply with Education Department policy. In particular the taking out of Insurance by SSA, the compliance of International Tours to Education Policy and finally the concept of equal representation at SSA meetings by each State and Territory. This is something that Ian Temby, Ian McMahon, Jeff Scott and I have been advocating for 25 Years. I am glad that it is coming to fruition and was established in November 2013 with the adoption of the new constitutional changes that are being suggested. Also SSWA is blessed with another terrific leader and supporter of School Sport in our former direct line Manager **Karen WEBSTER**. She has been a tower of strength in leading our association and supporting us in times of difficulty. **David AXWORTHY** has always been a great supporter and advocate for SSWA and it is terrific that he takes the time to be present at our major functions particularly the Presentation Dinner.

NATIONAL SCENE

Under the new constitution, which was passed at the November Conference on the Gold Coast, there will be a new structure for School Sport Australia. Each State and Territory jurisdiction will be represented on the Management board for SSA. At the moment WA is fortunate in that we have two representatives. Peter Smith is the SSWA representative on the SSA Board. Congratulations to Robyn Brierley on her appointment to the International Tours Committee for SSA. Also Conferences for SSA will be limited to one per year in the future. In 2013 the SSA Conference and AGM was held in Queensland, in October.

FUTURE CHALLENGES

I have already spoken about the volunteer and the importance of being vigilant in our recruitment of young teachers. This is a challenge to all involved with School Sport WA. We need to continue with our focus on encouraging teachers to play an active role in our organisation.

CONCLUSION

The SSWA Sport Coordinators give an enormous amount of volunteer time and effort to ensure that our programs are conducted professionally and efficiently. Without their valuable involvement we would be unable to present the extensive number of sports that we do. We acknowledge our fantastic Sport Coordinators and ask them to continue in this role for 2014.

On behalf of School Sport WA I would like to thank the Office staff of Peter Smith, Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt, Zoe Prue, Christine Sheen, Sally Ziris and the SSWA Management Committee for their ongoing excellent contribution to the increased efficiencies of SSWA, their professional work ethic and outstanding contribution in running and promoting SSWA. On behalf of School Sport WA, I applaud this generous donation of time that is freely given by so many of our volunteers; I believe participation in our programs allows students to achieve a wide range of educational outcomes. Once again I look forward to the coming year for your continued support, effort and dedication in helping organise and coordinate school sport as part of the wider family of School Sport WA.

I would once again like to thank Robyn Brierley [Executive Officer], Lynda Merritt [Executive Officer], Zoe Prue [Sports Administrator], Christine Sheen [Finance Officer] and Sally Zirniss [Junior Sports Administrator] for their outstanding commitment to SSWA over the year.

SSWA hosted five School Sport Australia National Championships in 2013. The Softball Championship was held at Mirrabooka, 15s Cricket at Guilford Grammar, Water Polo at Challenge Stadium, 12s Rugby League at Lark Hill and the combined Basketball at the State Basketball Centre. All events were extremely successful and showcased our wonderful state and our expertise in hosting National Championships.

SSWA participated in 23 School Sport Australia Championships in 2013 which involved 644 students and 98 staff in over 40 teams attending events all around Australia. SSWA had an outstanding year with many teams winning medals at the SSA events.

Senior High School and District High School Country Week events are still a highlight on the SSWA event calendar and continue to be strongly supported by regional schools attracting strong media coverage by local press. Senior High School Country Week brings over 3500 students and staff to Perth for a week long sporting carnival in July and District High Schools Country week sees almost 1000 staff and students from smaller and remote schools in attendance.

Our Champion Schools program continues to grow under the direction of our sport coordinators.

The SSWA webpage was upgraded late 2013 to incorporate a more modern look and feel. We look forward to increased usage in 2014. SSWA also initiated its own Facebook Page and Twitter account during the year.

SSWA takes this opportunity to thank all students, teachers and key delivery agents who assisted in any way with the presentation of School Sport WA in 2013. Special thanks to the management committee, the sport coordinators and their committees for their untiring voluntary efforts.

School Sport WA looks forward with anticipation to another busy year in 2014 and to the continued support of teachers in schools who volunteer their time to planning and preparing teams for events on behalf of their students.

2013 SECONDARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

2013 was another very successful year for Secondary School sport. The sporting opportunities afforded to students and teachers alike continue to grow in both quality and quantity. Thank you to our vast number of teacher volunteers. Our Interstate and Champion School Competitions included tens of thousands of secondary school students.

SSWA competed in 18 sports at secondary state level, sending away 26 teams or contingents. The SSWA Office conducted our flagship events of secondary Swimming and secondary Track and Field Carnivals; and again we saw increased numbers competing in the annual Country Senior High Schools Carnival and also in the District High Schools Carnival. Additionally, WA successfully hosted National Championships in Cricket, Softball, Water Polo and Basketball.

Champion School competitions were conducted in 27 different sports involving thousands of teachers and tens of thousands of students. In 2013 we welcomed Badminton to our competitions. Each school week of the year, thousands and thousands of school children engage in active, healthy, well structured sport through the Champion School Competitions.

The Secondary Management Committee continues to meet regularly to review policies and procedures as they relate to secondary school sport. Thank you to our Regional representatives for their ongoing work in linking SSWA and Sport in secondary schools. The network created through our regional representatives ensures we are linked directly to teachers in schools, allowing us to respond more directly to their needs.

Finally, let me thank the amazing range of volunteer teachers without whom our sports would not operate. Your efforts are the mainstay of SSWA. Thank you also to the extremely efficient and hard working SSWA Office Staff and to the members of the Secondary Management Committee for their diligence and dedication to School Sport in Western Australia.

2013 PRIMARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The primary sector continues to be an area of potential growth for SSWA. With interest being shown for the inclusion of two additional interstate sports in future years, being Golf and Cricket. It is imperative that our level of exposure and further development of the primary champion schools competitions continues. 2013 again saw an increased number of primary teachers appointed as interstate officials. The development of a primary school database with a direct sport contact in most primary schools has raised the awareness of SSWA and the opportunities available to the primary sector.

Interstate representation at the School Sport Australia Championships saw our 12's Netball team attend their second School Sport Australia Championship, in Maitland, NSW. The girls performed exceptionally well and caught many states by surprise winning a bronze medal in the round robin competition, narrowly missing out on silver by one goal.

12's Boys and Girls Hockey travelled to Canberra in August to defend their titles from 2012 and came away with the girls winning a bronze and boys finishing in 4th place. We would also like to commend the 12's Boys Football (soccer) team who finished with a silver medal at the Championships in Richlands, QLD. The girls finished 5th at the same event and SSWA would like to congratulate these students on their outstanding effort whilst away.

SSWA hosted two primary championships throughout 2013 which included 12's Boys and Girls Basketball which is held as a combined championship with the Secondary competition. This event was held at the WA Basketball Centre and the 12's boys' team finished with a bronze medal. The second event was the 12's Rugby League which was held at Lark Hill Sportsplex in Port Kennedy, for the first time. The event received fantastic support from WA Rugby League, National Rugby League and the City of Rockingham.

The SSWA Primary Triathlon was again held at Champion Lakes in November. The event involves over 145 teams from schools across the metropolitan area which includes approximately 440 students. SSWA would also like to acknowledge the support from Triathlon WA.

2013 was the 10th anniversary of the Primary Football (Soccer) "Glory Cup" champion schools event. This event commenced in 2004 with 20 teams and numbers have almost doubled over the 10 years. Together with the Girls Glory Cup there are now over 60 schools competing in the football champion schools competition. Congratulations and thanks go to the Primary Football Sport Coordinator Tony Caravajal for his efforts in promoting and developing the competition and ensuring the 10 year anniversary was celebrated. It is passionate teachers like Tony who ensure the success of SSWA events and programs.

There continues to be an increasing number of primary school teachers having active involvement in SSWA events. Many are then stepping up to management and coaching roles at the interstate level. The challenge still exists for our organisation to encourage more teachers to participate as leaders in the events overseen by SSWA, both at the interschool and the interstate levels.

SSWA welcomed a new primary school teacher onto the Primary Management Committee. Following 6 years of involvement as an interstate basketball official Clayton Bird has extended his link with SSWA and his expertise in primary school sport makes him a valuable asset on the committee. Lorraine Feddema was the tour leader for the interstate swimming and diving team and she continues her involvement in developing the students with disability area. John Lawniczak and Daryl Mansfield travelled with the interstate cross country competition and have again provided fantastic support with a number of champion school events. Alex McLennan supported the AFL 12s interstate team in a tour leader role and is very active as a sport convenor for a number of sports and provides valuable support with the basketball champion schools event.

I would also like to acknowledge the induction of John Lawniczak as a School Sport WA Life Member. John has been a keen advocate and an outstanding ambassador of SSWA for over twenty years. His commitment, passion and expertise for physical education and sport have had a significant impact at school, district and state levels. John has been a Primary Management Committee Member since 1999 and during this time he has overseen the introduction of interstate sporting opportunities as well as being the SSWA Primary Sport Coordinator for Table Tennis and Swimming.

The role of SSWA has been well documented and it does play the most significant part in providing sporting opportunities for students in WA schools.
