#### **2015 PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

#### OPPORTUNITY, ACHIEVEMENT AND COMPETITION

School Sport Western Australia (SSWA) values opportunity, achievement and competition. Participation in SSWA sporting programs provides a framework that gives students the opportunity to practise a healthy and active lifestyle, acquire and practise movement skills and build decision making and interpersonal skills. SSWA provides school students with many opportunities for the development of leadership and teamwork skills and provides schools with opportunities to build school spirit. By promoting positive attitudes of fair play SSWA aims to promote to young people the need to adopt a culture of respect and tolerance in which sportsmanship and competitiveness are not mutually exclusive. Finally in acknowledging their personal achievement, excellence and endeavour, SSWA aims to build self-esteem in young people and encourage the lifelong pursuit of an active and healthy lifestyle.

#### **VOLUNTEERS ARE THE LIFEBLOOD OF SSWA**

SSWA recognises the significant amount of volunteer time given in the running of our domestic competitions and our interstate programs. We need to be careful that we don't burn volunteers out because of their willingness to take on large work-loads. Again we need to be on the constant lookout for new, enthusiastic teachers to help run our programs. #### EXCELLENT LEADERSHIP AND SUPPORT PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

We are fortunate that we had Richard Lobb as our representative on the National Representative School Sport Committee (NRSSC). He continually supports SSWA in its endeavours to have School Sport Australia (SSA) comply with Education Department policy. We would like to thank Kim Ward, who has retired from the Department of Education and in turn stepped down from NRSSC, for the huge amount of work he did on behalf of the Department of Education and in particular SSWA. Also SSWA is blessed with another terrific leader and supporter of School Sport in our former direct line Manager – Peter Scaife. Karen Webster has been a tower of strength in leading our association and supporting us in times of difficulty. David Axworthy has always been a great supporter and advocate for SSWA and it is terrific that he takes the time to be present at our major functions particularly the Presentation Dinner. Welcome to Richard Lobb who is our new line manager for SSWA.

The existing funding Grant between the Department of Education and SSWA will expire on 30 June 2016. It is therefore recommended that ongoing funding is provided through a five year Funding Agreement.

#### ONCE AGAIN AN OUTSTANDING YEAR FOR SSWA ON THE INTERSTATE SCENE

SSWA hosted the 12 & Under Netball, and the combined 12 & Under and 16 & Under Hockey National Championships this year. Thanks to Netball WA, Hockey WA and UWA Hockey for their support and contribution to these events. All events were received with excellent reviews by all visiting states and territories. Credit must be awarded to our SSWA office and the meticulous work by our volunteer convenors, for each of those Championships, for their outstanding success.

A quick snap shot shows we were successful in a number of sports at the National level. 1<sup>st</sup> in Goal Ball at the PSG and 15s Boys Rugby League; 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 16s Girls and 15s Boys AFL; 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 12 AFL, 12s Boys Hockey, Surfing, 12s Tennis, 12s Boys, 15s Girls and 15s Boys Touch Football, 12s Boys and 19s Girls Football, Triathlon and Boys and Girls Water Polo.

#### INTERNATIONAL SCENE

The Pacific School Games took place in Adelaide in November. Nine sports contested the event with 400 students and teachers travelling to this major international multi-sport event. Many thanks to all our Officials who helped prepare and present teams, they are all to be commended on their commitment to ensuring that all competitions ran smoothly and ensuring that the students had a great time. Thanks to our early team of officials that were in Adelaide to organise the buses. Once again we were the only State to provide a Media team. Thanks Peter Sinclair for your involvement.

#### COUNTRY WEEK AND DOMESTIC COMPETITIONS

Our Senior High Schools Country week has grown to 47 schools and over 3,700 students and is probably the biggest sporting event for students in the southern hemisphere. The Tier System in the Senior High School Country Week is proving to be a great innovation for that competition. The 17<sup>th</sup> District High Schools competition saw 30 schools and over 1,000 students participate. Both events were resounding successes.

Our domestic competitions grow each year, and with the extension of Primary students into our Interstate program, this has directly influenced competitions at the local level. Secondary events continue to grow with Track & Field

Carnivals adding more schools to the Year 7-10 Division resulting in two concurrent carnivals being run on the same day - a great initiative.

#### **FUTURE CHALLENGES**

I have already spoken about the volunteer and the importance of being vigilant in our recruitment of young teachers. We have tried a number of different strategies to reward our volunteers. This is a challenge to all involved with SSWA. We need to continue with our focus on encouraging teachers to play an active role in our organisation.

<u>CONCLUSION</u>
The SSWA Sport Coordinators give an enormous amount of volunteer time and effort to ensure that our programs are conducted professionally and efficiently. Without their valuable involvement we would be unable to present the extensive number of sports that we do. We acknowledge our fantastic Sport Coordinators and ask them to continue in this role for 2016.

On behalf of School Sport WA I would like to sincerely thank the Office staff of Peter Smith, Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt, Zoe Prue, Christine Sheen, Sally Zirnis, Emily Taylor and the SSWA Management Committee for their ongoing excellent contribution to the increased efficiencies of SSWA, their professional work ethic and outstanding contribution in running and promoting SSWA.

#### 2015 SCHOOL SPORT WA DIRECTOR'S REPORT

I would once again like to thank Robyn Brierley [Executive Officer], Lynda Merritt [Executive Officer], Christine Sheen [Finance Officer], Zoe Prue [Sports Administrator], Sally Zirnis [Sports Administrator] and Emily Taylor [Sports Administrator] for their outstanding commitment to SSWA over the year.

SSWA hosted three School Sport Australia National Championships in 2015. The 12s Netball Championship was held at the State Netball Centre, 12s Hockey at UWA Sports Park and 16s Hockey at the Perth Hockey Stadium. The Hockey Championships were held concurrently. All events were extremely successful and showcased our wonderful state and our expertise in hosting National Championships.

School Sport Australia organised the Pacific School Games in Adelaide in November for the first time since 2008. SSWA sent 350 students and 50 staff to the event to participate in Football, Goalball, Table Tennis, Touch Football, Softball, Basketball, Swimming, Diving and Baseball. SSWA also sent a student Media Group to the games. From a student perspective the Games were a great success.

SSWA participated in 26 School Sport Australia Championships in 2015 which involved 750 students and 130 staff in over 40 teams attending events all around Australia. SSWA had an outstanding year with many teams winning medals at the SSA events.

Senior High School and District High School Country Week were again a highlight on the SSWA event calendar and continue to be strongly supported by regional schools attracting strong media coverage by local press. Senior High School Country Week brings over 3500 students and staff to Perth for a week long sporting carnival in July and District High Schools Country week sees almost 1000 staff and students from smaller and remote schools in attendance.

Our Champion Schools program continues to grow under the direction of our sport coordinators. Over 280 schools participated in at least one of over 45 competitions in 17 sports.

The SSWA Presentation Dinner held at the Hyatt Hotel was once again a fantastic celebration of the Interstate Team Program. The dinner was attended by over 500 people including students and team officials from our state teams, SSWA Management Members, DoE representatives, life members and parents.

SSWA takes this opportunity to thank all students, teachers and key delivery agents who assisted in any way with the presentation of School Sport WA in 2015. Special thanks to the management committee, the sport coordinators and their committees for their untiring voluntary efforts.

School Sport WA looks forward with anticipation to another busy year in 2016 and to the continued support of teachers in schools who volunteer their time to planning and preparing teams for events on behalf of their students.

#### 2015 SECONDARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

2015 was a very successful year for Secondary School sport. The quality and number of sporting opportunities afforded to students and teachers alike continued to grow in both quality and quantity, thanks again to the vast number of teacher volunteers. Our Interstate and Champion Schools Competitions offer opportunities to compete at various levels for all school students across all sectors.

SSWA competed in 19 sports at secondary state level, sending away 27 teams or contingents. SSWA Office conducted our flagship events of secondary Swimming and secondary Track and Field Carnivals; and again we saw increased numbers competing in the annual Country Senior High Schools Carnival and also in the District High Schools Carnival. Additionally, WA successfully hosted National Championships in Boys and Girls Hockey.

Champion Schools competitions were conducted in 27 different sports involving thousands of teachers and tens of thousands of students. Every school week of the year, thousands and thousands of school children engage in active, healthy, well-structured sport through the Champions Schools Competitions.

The Secondary Management Committee continues to meet regularly to review policies and procedures as they relate to secondary school sport. Thank you to our Regional representatives for their ongoing work in linking SSWA and Sport in secondary schools. The network created through our regional representatives ensures we are linked directly to teachers in schools, allowing us to respond more directly to their needs. Our South West region continues to grow and metropolitan regions are looking to utilize that model for their own Lightning Carnivals.

The Pacific School Games were held in Adelaide in 2015 and we were represented in 8 different sports at secondary level. Most pleasing were gold medals in the Multi Class (Disabled) events in Table tennis and Goalball.

Finally, let me thank the amazing range of volunteer teachers without whom our sports would not operate. Your efforts are the mainstay of SSWA. Thank you also to the extremely efficient and hard working SSWA Office Staff and to the members of the Secondary Management Committee for their diligence and dedication to School Sport in Western Australia.

#### 2015 PRIMARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The primary sector continues to expand at an Interstate level and with interest being shown in a number of sports, we are building to a full complement of 12 year and under Interstate sports. Cricket has now been included for primary girls and boys, for 2015. These teams competed in early 2016. The boys were overpowered by many of the other states but managed a win in their last game. We struggled to get a full WA girls team and ended up with a mainly WA team with extras from SA and a top up from host state Queensland. The team enjoyed the experience and will be stronger for it in future events. It is imperative that our level of exposure and further development of the primary champion schools competitions continues.

Recent years have seen an increased number of primary school teachers appointed as interstate officials. 2015 was a very successful year for the 12 years and under Interstate program with the highest ever number of our teams bringing home medals.

The 12 and under AFL Football Championship was held in Geelong in August. The boys played with passion and energy and it was an outstanding effort to bring home their second Bronze Medal, since our inaugural year in the competition, 2010. The 12 and under tennis team competed in Hobart and produced their best performance since 2009, adding a second bronze medal to their history.

SSWA hosted the 12 years and under Hockey. The Championship was held concurrently with the 16 years and under boys and girls and was a great success. The boys performed fantastically, in what was a very close championship, coming away with a bronze medal after only conceding one game. The girls had a great week of hockey and were unlucky not to finish higher than fourth.

In our 5<sup>th</sup> year in the competition SSWA hosted our first 12 years and under SSA Netball Championship. The championship received fantastic support from Netball WA and was flagged as "The best championship, so far" by the National Secretary. The girls were delighted to be able to play in front of a vocal home crowd, although 5<sup>th</sup> place was the best the girls could manage, the last day of play was tremendous with the team beating the potential silver medallist in a convincing win.

Our cross country team travelled to Melbourne, the WA team was at its strongest as we were able to travel with 10 and 11 year olds in our team, due to a change in policy allowing 10 and 11 year olds to travel but stay with their parents.

The Pacific School Games were held for the first time since 2008 and SSWA was represented in a number of 12 years and under sports. The 12 and under Boys Football (soccer) team won a bronze medal, whilst the girls were one goal away from doing the same, finishing a very credible 4<sup>th</sup>. Both the boys and girls Touch Football teams had a fantastic championship with the boys winning our first ever Bronze medal in the 12 years and under age group and the girls finishing 4<sup>th</sup>. Our boys and girls basketball teams finished 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> respectively. We also had primary students in the swimming, table tennis and goal ball teams, the students acquitted themselves well, with 2 primary students in Goal Ball gold medal team.

The SSWA Triathlon was again held in November with a combined event being tried for the first time, due to venue availability. Unfortunately this event was not as successful as hoped as the primary contingent was overwhelmed by the secondary section. The event will return to a separate event in 2016. This event involves a huge number of teams from schools across the metropolitan area. There is some discussion about having an individual triathlon for primary in 2016, as well as having events with composite teams. SSWA would also like to acknowledge the support from Triathlon WA.

There continues to be an increasing number of primary school teachers having active involvement in SSWA events. Many are then stepping up to management and coaching roles at the interstate level. The challenge still exists for our organisation to encourage more teachers to participate as leaders in the events overseen by SSWA, both at the interschool and the interstate levels.

The primary management committee has continued to work diligently to develop primary sport. Clayton Bird and Daryl Mansfield have made a significant contribution to the committee. Lorraine Feddema was the tour leader for the Volleyball and Goal Ball interstate teams and she continues her involvement in developing the students with disability area. John Lawniczak travelled with the state cross country and swimming teams and has again provided fantastic support with a number of champion school events. Alex McLennan supported the AFL 12s and Combined Basketball interstate teams in a tour leader role; he is very active as a sport convenor for a number of sports and provides valuable support with the basketball champion schools event.

The role of SSWA has been well documented and it does play the most significant part in providing sporting opportunities for students in WA schools. The volunteers are an essential part of our organisation being able to

provide these events for our students. However, the role of the SSWA office staff cannot be underestimated. The hard work and dedication of the office team is another critical factor in the quantity and quality that is offered to WA students. My sincere thanks to Peter Smith, Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt, Zoe Prue, Christine Sheen, Sally Zirnis and Emily Taylor. Many thanks to the Primary Management Group of Daryl Mansfield, John Lawniczak, Alex McLennan, Lorraine Feddema and Clayton Bird. Your efforts are much appreciated.

Our focus for 2016 will be to attract new and younger members to step in to the roles on Management. The "retired" members have served our organization superbly but there is a need for new people to invigorate our management group.
