## 2016 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The AGM will mark the 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary of the commencement of my role as President of SSWA and I would like to thank all members who have helped to make the year a very productive and memorable one. A highlight for me was the signing of the new Funding Agreement with the Education Department which has placed the Association on a sound financial footing for the next 3 years. I have seen the continued development of our offerings which continue to grow, most particularly in the primary sector, and a steady growth of the number of schools and individuals accessing our events. We will continue to provide quality competitions to allow our students to reach their potential in an educational setting.

#### The Interstate Scene

SSWA hosted 3 National Championships this year and as usual the feedback from all participants was very positive. We pride ourselves here in the West on conducting championships of the highest order.

The 17&U Boys Baseball National Championships was held at the Baseball Park in Thornlie and had to cope with a bit of wet weather but Mark Petit, Peter and Lynda Merritt and their crew did a marvellous job throughout the week. To cap off a great week the boys won the Gold medal after a wonderful series of games.

The 12&U and 19&U Football Championships were held concurrently at Lark Hill Sports Complex and once again the reviews from all states and territories were high praise indeed. I was fortunate to be tournament director for the 19 and under tournament and Matthew Donlevy was the director for the 12&U event, all up involving 26 teams, which was the first time the two events had been conducted simultaneously. Our thanks also to Mike Green, Tony Campbell, Joe Wright and Paddy Rooney.

The Touch Football Championships were also held at the wonderful Meadow Springs Sports Complex and was a very successful week once again. Our thanks go to Robyn Brierley, Kelly Wetton, Luke Miller and Anelise Stringer for the stirling work done in the organisation of the Championships.

2016 will be a difficult year to emulate as in addition to the Baseball, Gold medals were won by the 12&U Boys Hockey and the 15&U Girls Netball teams. Silver medals were achieved by the 15&U Boys Hockey, 12&U Tennis, 12&U Basketball Boys and the Triathlon team. To cap off a wonderfully successful interstate program no fewer than 14 of our teams won a bronze medal in what surely has been one of our most successful years on the interstate scene. Congratulations to all staff in all teams who ensured that all of our student athletes were well coached and well managed.

Our Senior High Schools and District High Schools Country Week carnivals continue to grow and expand and have shown themselves to be flag ship events on the SSWA calendar. These events provide valuable sporting and cultural experiences for our country students.

#### Praise for Volunteerism

Our association could not function without the tremendous time given up by our enormous number of volunteers. The last twelve months has seen some 6000 teachers involved in our programs at some point or other. SSWA recognises the significant amount of volunteer time given in the running of our domestic competitions and also our interstate programs. We need to be constantly vigilant for new enthusiastic individuals to bring into our volunteer networks. Ours is an ageing workforce and it is therefore imperative that replacements are found for our retiring volunteers. Please continue to encourage and recruit young teachers to join us in our endeavours.

The prestigious Award of Life Membership of our Association last year was bestowed upon Mr Mike Wrenn and Mr Ray Barrett. I cannot begin to outline the enormous contribution that these two gentlemen have made to our association in a combined teaching career spanning 80 years. Thank you for your years of service and assistance to School Sport WA and congratulations to you both.

#### Pacific School Games

The Pacific School Games will once again be held in Adelaide during the first ten days of December. The Western Australian contingent is likely to be in excess of 350 students and 70 staff members travelling to this major International multi-sport event for talented athletes competing in 10 different sports and we wish them all well.

#### Conclusion

2016 has been a tremendously busy year. The number of sports on the SSWA calendar continues to grow as does the number of schools participating in our offerings and therefore the number of students. In order to continue to cater for these increases we must illicit the help of more volunteers each year. We acknowledge the work done by our Sport Co-ordinators and ask that they continue their fantastic efforts into 2017.

On behalf of School Sport WA I would like to sincerely thank the office staff of Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt, Zoe Prue, Christine Sheen, Sally Zirnis and Emily Taylor all very ably led by Peter Smith. Thanks also to the board for their ongoing contribution to the increased efficiencies of SSWA and their professional work ethic.

I look forward to the continued growth of our association in 2017 and beyond and the continued support, effort and dedication of everyone in helping to organise and coordinate school sport for the benefit of our students as part of the School Sport WA family. I look forward to meeting you all at various events as we continue to provide quality sporting opportunities for all school students.

I would once again like to thank the hard working SSWA office staff - Robyn Brierley [Executive Officer], Lynda Merritt [Executive Officer], Zoe Prue [Sports Administrator], Christine Sheen [Finance Officer], Sally Zirnis [Sports Administrator] and Emily Taylor [Sports Administrator] for their outstanding commitment to SSWA over the year.

SSWA hosted three School Sport Australia National Championships in 2016. The 17yrs and Under Baseball Championship was held at Baseball Park in Canning Vale, 12yrs and 19yrs and Under Football at Lark Hill and the 12yrs and 15yrs and Under Touch Football in Mandurah. All championships were extremely successful and showcased our wonderful state and our expertise in hosting National Championships.

SSWA participated in 26 School Sport Australia Championships in 2016 which involved more than 700 students and 120 staff in over 40 teams attending events all around Australia. SSWA had an outstanding year with many teams winning medals at the SSA Championships. SSWA also had more than 50 students selected into School Sport Australia - All Australian Teams which is a very worthy achievement.

The SSWA Presentation Dinner held at the Burswood Hotel in December was once again a fantastic celebration of the Interstate Team Program. The dinner was attended by over 500 people including students and team officials from our state teams, SSWA Management Members, Education Department representatives, life members and parents.

Senior High School and District High School Country Week were again a highlight on the SSWA event calendar and continue to be strongly supported by regional schools attracting strong media coverage by local press. Senior High School Country Week brings over 3700 students and staff to Perth for a week long sporting carnival in July and District High Schools Country week sees over 1000 staff and students from smaller and remote schools in attendance.

Our Champion Schools program continues to grow under the direction of our sport coordinators. Over 95,000 students from more than 600 schools are participating in our programs.

SSWA takes this opportunity to thank all students, teachers and key delivery agents who assisted in any way with the presentation of School Sport WA in 2016. Special thanks to the management committee, the sport coordinators and their committees for their untiring voluntary efforts.

School Sport WA looks forward with anticipation to another busy year in 2017 and to the continued support of teachers in schools who volunteer their time to planning and preparing teams for events on behalf of their students.

In 2016, SSWA competed in 20 sports at secondary state level. Additionally, WA successfully hosted National Championships in Baseball, Football and Touch Football.

Champion Schools competitions were conducted in over 20 different sports at secondary level. Every school week of the year, thousands and thousands of school children engage in active, healthy, well-structured sport through the Champion Schools Competitions.

Thank you to our regional representatives for their ongoing work in linking SSWA and sport in secondary schools. The network created through our regional representatives ensures we are linked directly to teachers in schools, allowing us to respond more directly to their needs.

Let me also thank the amazing range of volunteer teachers without whom our sports would not operate. Lastly, thank you also to the extremely efficient and hardworking SSWA Office Staff and to the members of the Secondary Management Committee for their diligence and dedication to School Sport in Western Australia.

## 2016 PRIMARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The primary sector continues to be an area of growth for SSWA. We almost have a full complement of Primary sports competing at School Sport Australia Championships. It is imperative that our level of exposure and further development of the primary champion schools competitions continues.

We continue to develop a primary school database with a direct sport contact in most schools; this has raised the awareness of SSWA and the opportunities available to the primary sector. Our goal is to have at least one SSWA Ambassador in each primary school.

Our 12 and under teams continue to develop across all sports with an indicator of this development being the success experienced by a number of our teams in 2016. Boys hockey won gold, the 12s tennis took out silver and the boys basketball, girls football (soccer) and the AFL team all came away with bronze medals.

The Primary Cross Country event was a huge success and it was pleasing to see a number of runners who had been chosen to represent WA at the nationals doing very well. This sport continues to develop, especially as we now take a full team of competitors to the interstate competition. This is great exposure for the 10 and 11 year olds

The SSWA Triathlon was held in November with a much welcomed return to a stand-alone event for the primary students. Following feedback from participating schools a girls only team event was introduced for the first time, this was very well supported and will continue into the future.

Our Primary Sport Coordinators work tirelessly across our 18 primary champion school events and I thank them for their efforts in ensuring high quality competitions are conducted. It is their enthusiasm that has led to increased numbers across the primary champion school competitions. 2016 saw the inaugural SSWA Handball Champion Schools competition contested in November, a massive thank you to Sport Coordinator, Mike Zyrucha, for coordinating this successful competition.

There continues to be an increasing number of primary school teachers having active involvement in SSWA events. Many are then stepping up to management and coaching roles at the interstate level. The challenge still exists for our organisation to encourage more teachers to participate as leaders in the events overseen by SSWA, both at the interschool and the interstate levels.

The primary management committee has continued to work diligently to develop primary sport. Clayton Bird has made a significant contribution to the committee and was an official with the 12s boys cricket. Lorraine Feddema was the tour leader for the interstate swimming team and she continues her involvement in developing the students with disability area. John Lawniczak has again provided fantastic support with a number of champion school events. Alex McLennan supported the AFL 12s interstate team in a tour leader role and he is very active as a sport convenor for a number of sports and provides valuable support with the basketball champion schools event. Narelle Scott was elected as a new member to the primary committee in early 2016 and she has continued her involvement with the 15 girls AFL team. Many thanks to Narelle, John, Alex, Lorraine, Clayton and Daryl Mansfield (from afar) - your efforts are much appreciated.

The role of SSWA has been well documented and it does play the most significant part in providing sporting opportunities for students in WA schools. The volunteers are an essential part of our organisation being able to provide these events for our students. However, the role of the SSWA office staff cannot be underestimated. The hard work and dedication of the office team is another critical factor in the quantity and quality of sport that is offered to WA students. My sincere thanks to Peter Smith, Robyn Brierley, Lynda Merritt, Zoe Prue, Christine Sheen, Sally Zirnis and Emily Taylor.

Our 2017 focus is to attract new and younger members to step into roles on Management. The "retired" members have served our organisation superbly but there is a need for new people to invigorate our management group.
