2006 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

INTRODUCTION

School Sport WA (SSWA) has enjoyed a successful year with a number of innovations in management and program challenges that have added value to our product of quality competitive sport to students in all WA schools.

The retirement of Ian Temby on the 30 November after more than 40 years of service to sport in schools. Ian began his teaching career in the 60's and commenced with School Sport WA in 1984. He has been a tireless worker and a tremendous contributor for SSWA over many years and he the major reason that SSWA has the status that it has today. He will be sadly missed by all at SSWA and School Sport Australia.

Peter Smith will replace Ian Temby and Daryl Bell will replace Peter Smith in an acting capacity until mid-year. Then the positions will be advertised as permanent positions.

The appointment of Peter Smith to the office team has added a dimension that has allowed us, through his expertise, to improve information technology to our two way communication with schools and also to refine current office practice to improve operational efficiencies. After almost 4 years of service Janine Smith has move on to bigger and better things. Janine has been a fantastic worker for School Sport and will be sadly missed. We wish her every success in her future endeavours. Zoe Ainsworth has been appointed as the Assistant to the Director and has done a magnificent job in replacing Janine. Silvia Wijaya our Finance Officer has resigned. She has done a super job in getting our finances into practical and manageable areas. She was difficult to replace but I believe we have a very admirable and competent replacement in Christine Sheen.

At an interschool level our levels of participation have maintained good participation rates but it is becoming increasingly obvious that there are many paid initiatives encroaching teacher choice to voluntarily offer their time to interschool teams. In interstate terms our hosting of the SSA Secondary Cricket, Basketball, Golf, Orienteering, Touch and Rugby League Championships was extremely successful and our travelling teams did very well in their representative endeavours. Internationally SSWA once again had teams travel to South Africa, a particularly sporting and educationally rewarding exercise and we also had arrangements in place to send Country SHS teams to the Tau Games in Fiji. But, unfortunately, due to the political climate it had to be cancelled at the last moment.

SSWA looks forward to 2007 not only for the challenge of insuring continued high levels of participation in grass roots competition but also to the hosting of two national championships in Perth. We salute and thank the 6500 plus teachers who assist us in the presentation of our programs.

INNOVATION

- 1. Improved two way communication levels electronically with our schools.
- 2. A comprehensive schools and partner data base.

- 4. A comprehensive program evaluation strategy.
- 5. A culminating middle school final series that has incorporated existing programs in schools.
- 6. The development of clear and comprehensive selection criteria for interstate team student and team selection.
- 7. A uniforming tender process that sees KEA International Sportswear as our provider for the next three years.
- 8. An ongoing management restructure that has involved Constitutional change to officially acknowledge the emergence of the primary area in its own right.

PRIMARY ADVANCES

We have continued to "Build The Base" at the primary school level and have fostered the stronger links with parent sporting bodies. The School Sport WA Primary Management Group is developing its operational structure and is forming a management process that will bring it more into line with our eastern state counterparts. Our focus for Primary Schools is to offer the opportunity to be involved in centrally coordinated quality interschool events in a number of sports. We have introduced primary participation in a number of national exchanges at the state level for Primary Schools. Primary's now compete in Cross Country, Pacific School Games, Basketball, Touch and Tennis. At a grass roots level the Primary offering has grown to 20 sports and is expanding in participation terms at an amazing rate.

SSWA PROGRAMS

SSWA continues its commitment to all students in WA schools with a comprehensive and diverse offering of sporting opportunity. The larger events – Swimming, Track and Field, Senior High School and District High School Country Weeks continue to flourish with increased participation in all of these areas.

SCHOOL SPORT WA DIRECTORS REPORT 2006

School Sport WA hosted six national championships in 2006. Cricket, Golf, Basketball, Orienteering, Rugby League and Touch were all held in Perth. The Cricket Championships were staged in April with the WA team winning the championship for the first time. The Golf Championships were held at the Vines in August, Rugby League in June, Orienteering in September, Basketball in August and Touch in October. All events ran smoothly. In 2007 SSWA will host two interstate events – Softball and Cross Country. Plans are well advanced for each of these events and early indications are that all states and territories will be represented.

SSWA welcomed Zoë Ainsworth to the office in February as a Sports Administrator and Christine Sheen in June as our Finance Officer. Zoë and Chris are to be commended on the outstanding contributions they have made to the organisation.

lan Temby retired from SSWA in December after over 20 years of service in the positions of Executive Officer and Director of Sport. Ian's enormous contribution to SSWA was acknowledged at the SSWA Presentation Evening and at a retirement function held for him in December. Ian is largely responsible for the strong position of SSWA today and he will be sadly missed from the organisation.

The SSWA AGM was held in March and all management positions were filled. The day coincided with an Orientation Day for all Interstate Team managers, Sport Coordinators and Convenors.

At the AGM changes were made to the constitution to incorporate a Primary Management Committee. Our management structure now consists of President, Treasurer, Director of Sport, Executive Officer, Secondary Vice President, Primary Vice President, Secondary Committee Members, Primary Committee Members and Regional Representatives. This group meets on 8 occasions throughout the year.

SSWA conducted a Secondary Sports Tour of South Africa in July. Students from Narrogin SHS played netball and enjoyed the South African cultural experience. A similar tour to the Tau Games in Fiji was planned but unfortunately cancelled due to circumstances beyond SSWA control.

In 2006 we had 49 schools compete in our Swimming Carnivals at Challenge Stadium and 48 schools in the Track and Field Carnivals at Perry Lakes. Our Primary and Secondary Triathlons attracted over 800 competitors and over 3000 competitors ran in the Cross Country events.

The SSWA Presentation Evening was staged in November and it recognised team officials, sport coordinators, team captains, Australian representatives and medal winners. Special presentations were made to key officials from our National events hosted during the year, State Sporting Associations and the Department of Education and Training for their support throughout the year.

School Sport WA is pleased to report that its activities at both an interschool and interstate level continued to flourish in participation terms. New teams in the interstate program included: Primary boys and Girls Basketball, Primary Boys and Girls Touch; Primary Boys and Girls Tennis [Bruce Cup].

The SSWA web site continues to be a very valuable resource for us. The online nomination process has been very successful and schools are using the service heavily to nominate for our events.

The 8th District High Schools Country Week was held in September with 30 schools and over 900 competitors taking part. The event was opened and closed by the Minister for Education and Training. The 79th Senior Country Week had 39 schools represented. The Active Achievers program co coordinated by SSWA and Sport and Recreation continued to be successful and the Ausdance program, in its fourth year, continued to increase participation numbers.

SSWA continued to offer shirts, lanyards, pens, coffee cups and clipboards and other SSWA promotional items for purchase by schools and again it proved to be a very popular exercise. The DET newspaper "School Matters" continues its dedication of the back page to sport in schools.

SSWA takes this opportunity to thank all students, teachers and key delivery agents who assisted in any way with the presentation of School Sport WA for 2006. Special thanks are reserved for the management committee, the sport coordinators and their committees for their untiring voluntary efforts. The substantial contribution of office staff is acknowledged and they are thanked for their tireless dedication to the efficient running of the organisation.

School Sport WA looks forward with anticipation to a very busy year ahead and to the continued support of teachers in schools on behalf of their students.

Secondary Management Committee Report 2006

2006 was again a busy year for Secondary School Sport. Thanks to our extensive range of enthusiastic volunteers, Champion Schools competitions were conducted in 30 different sports. In this last year we have welcomed Handball and Lacrosse as trial sports.

SSWA competed in 28 Secondary sports at state level; hosted 6 Championships or Combined Events (Cricket, Golf, Basketball, Touch, Orienteering and Rugby League); conducted our flagship events of Secondary Track and Field and Swimming Carnivals; and saw increased numbers competing in the annual Country Senior High Schools Carnival and the District High Schools Carnival. Western Australia is currently National Champion in Boys Hockey and Boys Cricket.

For the fourth year, SSWA conducted a Secondary Sports Tour of South Africa that will be a lasting memory for all those lucky enough to attend. A similar tour to the Tau Games in Fiji was planned but unfortunately had to be cancelled. Schools are encouraged to consider nominating representative School Teams for the South African Tour in future years.

After a full year of the new management structure, the Secondary Management Committee is continuing to define its role. The network created through our regional representatives ensures we are linked directly to teachers in schools. The Committee will continue to monitor the sports and events it conducts to ensure viability and to increase assistance when needed. The recruitment and reward of volunteer teachers will continue to be a challenge for us to face. Similarly, the inclusion of Year 7 students in Senior High Schools and the coordination of secondary events with our growing primary sector will demand our attention in the future.

I would like to pay tribute to our retiring Chairman Jeff Scott, who has left teaching after a long career. Jeff has been a member of the SSWA Management for many years and has previously been recognised with Life Membership. His contribution to School Sport is Western Australia is significant and we thank him for his commitment and involvement.

Finally, let me thank the amazing range of volunteer teachers without whom our sports would not operate. Thank you also to the extremely efficient SSWA Office Staff and to the members of the Secondary Management Committee for their diligence and dedication to School Sport in Western Australia.

PRIMARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

2006 proved to be another year of considerable growth and development for the primary sector of School Sport WA. All sports attracted more schools, a larger number of students competing and a display of skills that indicate the programs within schools are achieving intended results.

Increased involvement in School Sport Australia Exchanges meant that WA students were able to compete at a high level and receive important educational and social experiences. The sports of tennis and touch participated in a School Sport Australia Exchange for the first time with teams performed creditably to indicate that WA is competitive at this level. Basketball, swimming and cross country also participated in SSA Exchanges to record pleasing results. SSWA recognises the highly professional manner in which coaches and managers conducted the selection trials, training sessions and participation at the event. In 2007 rugby league will compete in an Exchange for the first time and the sport committee has been working hard to develop their programs to enable a confident entry into this level of sport.

Currently SSWA Primary sports include three levels of status. Approved sports are sports that operate according to SSWA policies and guidelines and meet all sport requirements, affiliated sports are conducted with considerable assistance and input from state bodies and may not fully meet all sport requirements with regard coordinators or committee, and trial sports are developing sports working towards approved or affiliated status.

Approved sports: Australian rules football, basketball, cricket, cross country, football, golf, hockey, netball, rugby league, swimming, tee ball, tennis, triathlon

Affiliated sports: lacrosse, orienteering, table tennis, touch, volleyball

Trial sports: equestrian, handball,

Congratulations to Peter Della-Vedova on his nomination and acceptance as a Life Member of SSWA. This award recognises Peter's years of hard work in establishing the flourishing primary sport sector of SSWA and his commitment and involvement in a number of sports at domestic and state level.

SSWA congratulates and recognises the achievement of Robyn Brierley for being awarded the '2007 CrickED of the Year'. The award recognises an outstanding contribution from a teacher to the sport of cricket. Robyn represented WA and attended the Allan Border Medal evening in Melbourne as part of her award.

The Primary Management committee has completed a full year in the new structure and members have been working hard to establish a positive forum that will lead to further development of quality sporting opportunities for students and schools. My thanks to all for their ongoing, valued commitment to SSWA.
