On Behalf of SSWA I wish to extend to you all a sincere welcome to the 2008 AGM. I would like to acknow ledge the Life Members that are present today.

I am involved in this organisation on a voluntary basis like all teachers because I believe in the achievement of healthy and active lifestyles for students in our schools through sport. SSWA is a vehicle that provides a framework of choices that presents students with quality opportunities. We as members of SSWA should use every opportunity that presents itself to promote SSWA and reinforce the values of teamwork, leadership, self-confidence and the pursuit of excellence.

School Sport WA (SSWA) has enjoyed a successful year with a number of innovations in management and program challenges that have added value to our product of quality competitive sport to students in all WA school. I would personally like to thank all Sports Convenors, Sports Coordinators and their committees and acknowledge their hard work, dedication and effort throughout the year in helping present our programs for students.

The appointment of Peter Smith to the office team as the substantive Director of Sport has added a dimension that has allow ed us, through his expertise, to improve information technology to our two way communication with schools and also to refine current office practice to improve operational efficiencies.

At an interschool level our levels of participation have maintained good participation rates but it is becoming increasingly obvious that there are many paid initiatives encroaching teacher choice to voluntarily offer their time to interschool teams.

SSWA looks forward to 2008 not only for the challenge of ensuring continued high levels of participation in grass roots competition but also to the hosting of national championships in Perth. We salute and thank the 4,500 plus teachers who assist us in the presentation of our programs.

PRIMARY ADVANCES

We have continued to "Build the Base" at the primary school level and have fostered the stronger links with parent sporting bodies. The School Sport WA Primary Management Group is developing its operational structure and is forming a management process that will bring it more into line with our eastern state counterparts. Our focus for Primary Schools is to offer the opportunity to be involved in centrally coordinated quality interschool events in a number of sports. We have introduced primary participation in a number of national exchanges at the state level for Primary Schools. Primary's now compete in Cross Country, Pacific School Games, Basketball, Touch and Tennis. At a grass roots level the Primary offering has grow n to 19 sports and is expanding in participation terms at an amazing rate.

SSWA PROGRAMS

SSWA continues its commitment to all students in WA schools with a comprehensive and diverse offering of sporting opportunity. The larger events – swimming, track and field, senior and junior country week continue to flourish with increased participation in all of these areas.

2007 SCHOOL SPORT WA DIRECTOR'S REPORT

School Sport WA hosted two national championships in 2007. Softball Championship was held at the Mirrabooka Softball Centre and the Cross Country Championship was held at Perry Lakes and South Perth. Both events were very successful and received tremendous support from Softball WA and Athletics WA in the conduct of the Championships. In 2008 SSWA looks forward to hosting the Tennis Championship, incorporating the Pizzey Cup, in May and Surfing in November/December.

SSWA welcomed Darryl Bell to the office in January following the retirement of lan Temby. The office is now staffed by Peter Smith - Director of Sport, Darryl Bell - Executive Officer, Zoë Ainsworth - Sports Administrator and Christine Sheen - Finance Officer. I would like to commend Darryl, Zoë and Christine for their outstanding commitment to SSWA.

The SSWA AGM was held in March and all management positions were filled. Murray Farr continues in the role of President with Peter Sinclair – Secondary Committee Chairperson and Darryl Bell – Primary Committee Chairperson.

SSWA welcomed a new region to the management committee. The South West region representing Bunbury / Busselton / Margaret River schools has been included in our structure and we look forward to supporting competitive sport in this country area.

SSWA conducted a Secondary Sports Tour of South Africa in July. Students from Willetton SHS played netball and enjoyed the South African cultural experience.

In 2007 we had 50 schools compete in our Swimming Carnivals at Challenge Stadium and 48 schools in the Track and Field Carnivals at Perry Lakes. Our Primary and Secondary Triathlons attracted over 800 competitors and over 3000 athletes ran in the Cross Country events.

The SSWA Presentation Evening was staged in November and it recognised team officials, sport coordinators, team captains, Australian representatives and medal winners. Special presentations were made to key officials from our National events hosted during the year, State Sporting Associations and the Department of Education and Training for their support throughout the year.

The School Sport WA interstate team program continues to grow. A Western Australian Primary Rugby League team participated in the SSA Exchange for the first time in 2007.

The SSWA web site continues to be a very valuable resource for us. The online nomination process has been very successful and schools are using the service heavily to nominate for our events.

The 9th District High Schools Country Week was held in September with the number of participating schools increasing to 35 and over 1000 competitors taking part. The 80th Senior High Schools Country Week had 39 schools represented. Touch football was included in the participating sports for the first time and it proved to be very popular. The event also included the inaugural Country Week Gift footrace and a Green Light Disco. Both innovations were well supported.

SSWA takes this opportunity to thank all students, teachers and key delivery agents who assisted in any way with the presentation of School Sport WA in 2007. Special thanks are reserved for the management committee, the sport coordinators and their committees for their untiring voluntary efforts. The substantial contribution of office staff is acknowledged and they are thanked for their tireless dedication to the efficient running of the organisation.

School Sport WA looks forward with anticipation to a very busy year ahead and to the continued support of teachers in schools on behalf of their students.

2007 SECONDARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

2007 was full of activity for Secondary School Sport. Thanks again to the vast number of teacher volunteers our Interstate and Champion Schools Competitions included tens of thousands of secondary school students.

SSWA competed in 21 sports at secondary state level, sending away 26 teams or contingents. SSWA Office conducted our flagship events of secondary Swimming and secondary Track and Field Carnivals; and again we saw increased numbers competing in the annual Country Senior High Schools Carnival and also in the District High Schools Carnival. Additionally, WA successfully hosted two National Championships in Softball and Cross Country.

Champion Schools competitions were conducted in 28 different sports involving thousands of teachers and tens of thousands of students. Every school week of the year, thousands and thousands of school children engage in active, healthy, well structured sport through the Champions Schools Competitions.

For the fifth year, SSWA conducted a Secondary Sports Tour of South Africa involving students from Willetton Senior High School. These students enjoyed a fantastic sporting, cultural and educational experience and I am sure made memories that will last a lifetime. Schools are encouraged to consider nominating representative School Teams for the South African Tour in future years.

The Secondary Management Committee continues to meet regularly to review policies and procedures as they relate to secondary school sport. Thank you to our Regional representatives for their ongoing work in linking SSWA and Sport in secondary schools. The network created through our regional representatives ensures we are linked directly to teachers in schools, allowing us to respond more directly to their needs. During 2007 we saw an increased involvement from our new South West region, based in Bunbury and including a number of schools from that region. We look forward to further enhancement of that role, perhaps acting as a model for possible expansion to other country regions in the future.

2007 saw significant planning for the Pacific School Games to be held late in 2008. Planning is well under way to send our biggest ever contingent of primary and secondary students to Canberra to compete in Track and Field, Swimming, Diving, Boys and Hockey and Basketball.

Finally, let me thank the amazing range of volunteer teachers without whom our sports would not operate. Thank you also to the extremely efficient and hard working SSWA Office Staff and to the members of the Secondary Management Committee for their diligence and dedication to School Sport in Western Australia.

2007 PRIMARY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

Domestic programs continue to grow with an increase in number of sports, number of schools and competitor participation. Several programs have developed to include regional venues thus providing an opportunity for more schools to be involved. Football (soccer) expanded to include a very successful girl's competition and has gained valuable sponsorship to support this program. The golf program is examining a link with the Secondary Champion Schools event in an effort to attract country golfers and Golf Academy students. The swimming event will be revitalised to include more events and will be promoted as the State's premier primary school swimming carnival. In 2007 SSWA added Equestrian to the program and will explore the option of including Ultimate (flying disc) as a trial sport for 2008.

Strong partnerships with State Sporting Organisations (SSO) continue to be developed and explored. It is acknowledged that our links with SSO's are important for the development of sporting opportunities for students in schools.

At interstate Exchange level we competed in basketball, rugby league, cross country and tennis. It was the first time a School Sport WA (SSWA) team had participated in the School Sport Australia Rugby League Exchange and it proved a valuable experience for all concerned. SSWA also nominated 10 and 11 year olds to compete in the National Cross Country for the first time as it was a 'Home' Championship. The younger athletes performed well to record medal wins in several events. This year we did not present teams for swimming or touch but we are hopeful that these sports will soon return to the Exchange program.

Primary teams for the Pacific School Games (PSG) are already well into the planning stage for team trials and selection. The primary sports involved in the PSG include basketball, diving, hockey, swimming and track and field. Hockey will present teams for an interstate competition for the first time at this event.

We acknowledge and thank the hard working Primary Management Group who continue to consolidate existing events and develop new programs. We particularly congratulate Robyn Brierley who was awarded the prestigious 2007 'CrickEd of the Year' and 'AFL Ambassador of the Year' for her excellent work in promoting sport at primary level.

The SSWA office staff (Peter, Zoe, Christine and Rene) have provided outstanding support to all sport coordinators and are warmly acknowledged for their input into the success of the primary sport programs.
