GENERAL INFORMATION

DATE WEDNESDAY 18th September

COSTINGS The cost for schools to participate will be \$60 per team nominated.

UMPIRES Schools need to provide competent umpires for every team nominated They will also need to supply a scorer/check scorer for each game.

1. Football – Supplied
2. Soccer – 1 referee and 1 linesperson
3. Touch – 1 umpire
4. Hockey – 1 umpire
5. Netball – 1 umpire
6. Basketball – 1 umpire
7. Volleyball- A Grade - 1 umpire
8. Volleyball - B Grade – Supplied

Umpires will umpire their own school fixtures.

EQUIPMENT Each school needs to provide a quality match ball on the day. No equipment will be supplied.

FIRST AID Coaches and schools are responsible for conducting minor first aid and supplying a First Aid Kit for EACH venue. Ice will be available at each venue.

GAME RESULTS

Points will be allocated in all sports as; 3 points for a win, 2 points for a draw, and 1 points for a loss

Please ensure that your students/officials and parents are aware that there will be NO EXTRA TIME OR PENALTY SHOTS/FLICKS in the event of a drawn game during the normal rounds or finals. In the case of a drawn outcome places will be determined by:

1. Previous encounter between the two teams
2. Goal difference

(This is the same method that is used by SSWA at Country-week)

CANTEEN/FOOD

Availability of food is subject to each venue. There are some venues with NO food available.

- Volleyball – There will be food available on the day
- Basketball – All sports centres will have their canteen open but food tends to be limited at some venues.
- Netball, Touch and Football will both be serviced by Chips, Flips and Sips food van (at AFL)
- Soccer will not have a canteen– however there is the canteen open at hockey
- Hockey will have access to a canteen at the hockey stadium
- **Students should be encouraged to bring healthy alternatives to snack on during the day as there will be limited breaks for most sports.**

PRESENTATIONS

- There will be no presentations on the day but the shield will be given to the winning schools in each division on the day.
- The Champion School Shields (Tier 1 and Tier 2) will be announced the following day when results are collated.

- Schools will be allocated points based on finishing position in the highest division entered in the sport.
- Tier 1
For schools that have 9 or more teams. Points gained from the **best 9 point scoring competitions** will count in each school's total. The school with the most points from its best 9 competitions will be named Champion School.
- Tier 2
For schools that have 8 or less teams. Points gained from the **best 6 point scoring competitions** will count in each school's total. The school with the most points from its best 6 competitions will be named Champion School.

Start of Carnival

- Ensure that the playing grounds are safe (Nets/post covers etc have been put in place)
- Place on display a copy of fixtures and the results sheet for each grade.
- Before first fixture have a quick meeting with all Teachers in Charge of your sport. Please introduce yourself as contact person for the day, outline to them how the day will run, ensure they all have supplied umpires, point out emergency exits, and let them know what happens if there is a serious injury (see below)

During the Carnival

- All fixtures are centrally timed – sound horn/buzzer to start/stop games
- I will drop ice off at the start of the day
- Winning team to return score sheet to you – update results sheet.
- Points are allocated as follows; 3 points for a win, 2 for a draw and 1 for a loss.
- Where finals are played you will need to work out final placings and final fixtures and place on display
- Please note that NO EXTRA TIME OR PENALTY SHOTS/FLICKS will be played in normal fixtures or finals if there is a drawn result. As per how it is worked out at countryweek final placings are determined by;
 - a. Previous encounter between the two teams
 - b. If this was a draw then it goes to goal difference.
- All schools should have their own first Aid kit for minor injuries – Ice has been supplied at all venues.
- All students, staff and parents are expected to display good sportsmanship throughout the carnival– If there is any serious breach of sportsmanship (physical abuse, racial vilification etc) the player can be removed from participating for the rest of the carnival. If this happens please work with the teacher in charge and ring me if you are unsure how to proceed. For any incidents (injury or behaviour) please complete an Incident Report and give to Jason Reid at the conclusion of the day. (Incident Reports are in your file)

End of Day

- There will be no presentations held at the end of the day.
- During the last couple of fixtures please encourage schools to do a big clean up of the venue and help tidy up – if equipment/goal post pads/nets need to be taken down get the last teams playing to do these jobs so you are not left with it at the end of the day
- Please ensure that everything is neat and tidy before you leave.
- If I have not made it to your venue to collect results and ice eskies please take them with you and I will arrange to collect from you either that afternoon or the next day.

Number of Players:

- Please note the following numbers on field at any one time
 - A Grade football =18 players
 - B Grade Football =15 players
 - Girls Football = 12 players.

Rules:

- A size 4 leather game football will be supplied by each competing team (Both Boys and Girls).
- Games will consist of 2 x 10 minute halves, with a 2 minute half time break and a 6 minute changeover between games. All games will be centrally timed.
- The first named team will be "home" team and the second named team the "away" team.
- Players are to wear numbered school jumpers.
- Start and end-of-game acknowledgments:
 - The home team lines up in the centre of the ground and waits until the away team lines up opposite.
 - At the completion of the game each team captain will call his team to give 3 cheers to the other team.
- Points for games: 3 points for a win, 2 points for a draw, 1 point for a loss
- The "Last Touch" rule will be implemented in all matches so there will be no need for a boundary umpire. A free kick will be awarded against the team who clearly kicks or handballs the ball over the boundary line. If the ball goes over in dispute, or off hands, then the umpire will throw the ball up 10m in from the boundary.
- Each school must provide one goal umpire with goal flags.
- Playing times – check fixtures
- The competition will be decided in two parts.
 - Qualifying rounds to decide finals ranking:
 - Most number of points; Successful team in previous clash; Percentage for participating teams in contention; then
 - Overall percentage
- Finals result: Direct result; then Team who finished higher after qualifying rounds.
- Player Even Up Rule
 - Teams require a minimum:
 - 12 player for Boys A Grade
 - 9 players for Boys B Grade
 - 7 players for Girls.
 - The even up rule will apply when one or two teams have less than the maximum number.
 - An even up number of players from both teams are to start the match on field; and must always be on the field, except if a red or yellow card is issued.
 - If a player is injured and the team has no replacement, the opposition team must even up immediately
 - Players must be rotated so that no single player plays more than 1 half per match for the opposition team
 - Any team that refuses the even up provisions will be deemed as losing the game and forfeiting any points and percentages earned during that game

- The following number in each team are allowed for substitution purposes; 16

Rules:

- Games will consist of 1x20 minute game, with a 5 minute changeover between games. All games will be centrally timed.
- There will be no extra time or penalty kicks in the event of a drawn game during the normal round or finals.
- Schools need to provide a suitable field umpire and line umpire for each team entered. Umpires will follow their own school for the day. In the absence of an umpire being provided the coach will be required to umpire.
- Each team to provide a standard Size 5 ball for each match.
- During the games five (5) interchange players are allowed.
- A mixed team may be entered under to play in the Boys Competition.
- Schools are reminded to provide an alternate strip or neutral coloured top in case of team colours clashing.
- **Shin pads must be worn by all players.** Failure to comply will result in the individual not playing.
- Points for games:
 - 3 points for a win
 - 2 points for a draw
 - 1 point for a loss
- Exclusions will be decided under normal rules and conditions for soccer. A player who is Red Carded receives an automatic suspension for the next game. Other sanctions and procedures are common to all sports and are documented in Section 4.
- The competition will be decided in two parts.
 - a. Qualifying rounds to decide finals ranking:
 - Most number of points;
 - Successful team in previous clash;
 - Goal difference;
 - Highest number of goals scored; and
 - Penalty shoot-out.
 - *Note: In the event of more than 2 teams ending on the same # of points ignore the previous clash and go to goal difference. Only consider goal difference for games between the teams equal on points.*
 - b. Finals result:
 - Direct result; then team who finished higher after qualifying rounds.

- Games will consist of 2 x 10 minute halves, with a 2 minute half time break and a 6 minute changeover between games. All games will be centrally timed.
- Mixed teams must always have four girls on the field at any time. 5 interchange players are allowed.
- Each team to provide a dimpled white ball for each match.
- Schools are reminded to provide a neutral coloured top in the case of team colours clashing. In the event of a uniform colour clash the first mentioned team to have choice of playing strip colour.
- Modified Rules: No tomahawk, Drag flick, or overheads.
- Points for games: 3 points for a win, 2 points for a draw, 1 point for a loss
- There will be no extra time or penalty flicks in the event of a drawn game during the normal round or finals. To determine final places in the outcome of a draw places will be determined by :

All three sets will be played to 15 points (**capped**), rally point. When time is called in a match the team that is in front wins. If the scores are tied – next point wins (golden point)
- Match starting time. The competition will run on a **central start time**.
- Warm-up period will be 5 minutes and commence as soon as the whistle to finish the previous match is sounded. The first scheduled match will start at the designated time - warm-up must be completed before this time. **Team warm-ups other than the designated 5 minutes on court are not to be conducted in the playing arena.**
- Substitutions: A Grade to use the 12-sub rule. **Other grades substitutions are to be the 12-sub rule or rotation of all team players through position one. The system used must be maintained for the entire game.**

FINALS RESULTS

1. The finals will be the best of three sets conducted under the same scoring conditions as preliminary games.
2. A team winning the first two sets will be declared the winning team.
3. In the event of a third set being required the set will be live at any score (a team can win 1-0 in the third set)

B GRADE

- Scoring – point per rally. NO limit on score so teams keep scoring until time runs out.
- Games will be 20 minutes with 3 minutes between games
- The ball must be served within 1.5mtrs from the back right hand corner of your side of the court. The ball can be served over arm or under arm. One missed ball toss will be allowed, on second ball toss the ball must be served or a foul will be given. The ball must not have contact with any nets whilst being served.
- All players must serve in rotation.
- All players are to rotate clockwise on winning the serve, whether your team is serving or you're the receiving team you must stand in your correct rotation.
- The ball must be hit (set or dug) twice on receiving the serve before returning the ball back over the centre net after this the ball can be hit straight back during the rally.
- All nets can be used in general play, except when serving the ball, or contact with the top net when it is returned over the centre net to the oppositions side of the court, this is deemed a foul.
- Any contact with the centre net by a player whilst the ball is in play will result in a foul. Loose clothing or hair is not considered a net touch.
- A block at the centre net is not included as part of the three hits. The blocking player is entitled to play at the ball again on the consecutive shot. Two hands must be used to constitute a block.
- No player is permitted to reach over the centre net when the ball is in play. If the umpire deems a player has reached over the net during play in attack or defence, the player will be fouled.
- Any kicking of the ball may result in a deduction of points; continuation of kicking the ball may result in a send off (at umpire's discretion).
Players unnecessarily abusing the nets may result in a send off.
Players may not physically use the nets to assist in general play.
- The point or serve is lost when:
 - The ball touches the ground.
 - Team plays the ball more than three times in succession.
 - The ball touches a player below the waist.
 - A player touches the ball twice consecutively (except on a block).
 - A player touches the centre net.
 - The ball touches the top net (except when setting to your own player).
 - A player blocks or spikes the ball back over the centre net off the serve (e.g. must be two hits off a serve) from the receiving team.
 - The ball does not pass over the net on the serve.
 - The umpire calls a carry, double hit, top net or net touch.
 - A player interferes with an opponent's player.
 - The serve is made from outside the serving area.
 - A player kicks the ball. A player attacking or defending reaches over the net.
 - A player abuses the umpire.
 - The ball hits a net when served.

- Normal school Rules apply in relation to physical abuse, verbal abuse and vilification of opposing team members and officials.

Staff Code of Behaviour

- Ensure that the sport is appropriate for the age group and the skill development level of the players involved.
- Teach your players to be friendly towards officials and opponents.
- Remove from the field of play any of your players whose behaviour is not acceptable.
- Keep your own knowledge of coaching and the developments of the game up to date.
- Support School Sport Australia's policy of a smoke and alcohol free environment. " Encourage a positive attitude towards school sport through;
 1. emphasise fun and enjoyment
 2. Encourage both teams
 3. Set a good example
 4. encourage the pursuit of personal excellence

Parents and Spectators Code of Behaviour

Encourage participation by your children.

- Provide a model of good sportsmanship for your child to copy.
- Demonstrate appropriate social behaviour.
- Remember children play for enjoyment. Don't let your behaviour detract from their enjoyment.
- Let game officials conduct events without interference.
- Support skilled performances and team play with generous applause.
- Demonstrate respect for opposing players and their supporters.
- Support School Sport Australia's policy of a smoke and alcohol free environment

It is recognised that for the majority of SWSSA events, almost all participants compete and behave in an outstanding manner in line with the expectations of the Association's Codes of Behaviour

Duty of Care Provisions

When unacceptable behaviour occurs during SWSSA events, contravening the Codes of Behaviour, and is considered serious enough to warrant immediate and/or further action, the following procedures would occur:

- Any serious breach of the Codes of Behaviour on the day of a carnival should be reported to the Sports Co-ordinator at the venue ASAP. The sports co-ordinator, in liaison with the relevant school's TIC at the venue, will investigate the incident and determine an appropriate course of action.
- Courses of action **could** include:
- Dealing with the incident on the spot
- Suspending the student from further participation in the event – Advising the Phys Ed HOLA and Principal of the student's school – Sending the student home at the expense of the parents.
- If the incident was deemed serious enough to suspend the student from participation for the remainder of the event, the sports co-ordinator would make contact with the Carnival Coordinator ASAP. The Carnival Co-ordinator would then contact the School's HOLA to arrange parent/school contact.
- At the conclusion of the event, sports co-ordinators and/or schools should submit an incident report form (available at carnivals or on the SSWA website) to the Carnival Co-ordinator for any serious incidents that occurred at the carnival, or any issues that arose during the day that were not dealt with.
- Following a carnival, the SWSSA Management Committee reserves the right to recommend to its member schools any further disciplinary action it feels may be warranted.

Examples of Serious Breaches of Inappropriate Student Behaviour that would warrant further action:

- Having or using Alcohol or other illegal drugs or substances
- Smoking
- Sexual harassment
- Vandalism or other criminal offences
- Swearing or verbally abusing officials or opposition players.
- Physical violence towards others
- Harassment or vilification of others
- Refusing to comply with instructions
- Poor sportsmanship or cheating

MEDICAL PROVISION

All venues must make provision for first aid. If an ambulance is required, it will need to be called via usual protocols. Schools are requested to ensure that they adequately provide for their own immediate ongoing medical needs by the provision of first-aid equipment. Provide your own strapping.

St. Johns' Ambulance has been notified of the event.

The Sport Coordinator has access to a telephone and has contact numbers for local practitioners, including ambulance. Should the need arise all venue managers will consider medical problems a priority.

Ice will be provided at each venue.
